

Laurel Furniture Opening Is Grand

Laurel Furniture Co.'s Plymouth outlet has been in business several weeks, and last weekend it celebrated its grand opening by giving 33 visitors prizes from its stock.

"This is our second branch," said Don Wurm, manager of the store at 584 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

His father, Julius Wurm, has been in the business for 25 years, 20 using the name "Laurel." That's the first name of another of Julius Wurm's sons.

The 9,000 square foot store previously belonged to Snyder Furniture Co. Laurel Furniture bought the building, "we have everything you'd need in a house, in all price ranges," the young manager said. "On the floor we must have 20 or more bedroom sets, for example, and 13 or more dining room sets."

A native of Detroit, Don Wurm now lives in Plymouth. He has been "in and out of the furniture business all my life," a full-time merchant for about four years. He attended Lawrence Institute of Technology and Henry Ford Community College.

Sign Up Now At Schoolcraft

Now is the time to sign up for evening classes during winter semester at Schoolcraft Community College.

You have about 160 courses to choose among, ranging from business skills for the smallest operator to physics.

You can choose something for job skill improvement or something to apply to a major college degree.

BUT HURRY, especially if you've never taken a course at Schoolcraft before. Application for admission in such a case is urged immediately, to the admissions office on campus on Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile roads.

Registration dates are through Dec. 15 by mail and Jan. 5 and 6 in person, for those who are admitted. Anyone registering after

classes begin Jan. 7 and up to 8 p.m. of the absolute closing date of Jan. 13 will be charged a late registration fee -- providing there is room in desired classes.

RESIDENTS OF THE five secondary school districts belonging to Schoolcraft district -- Clawsonville, Livonia, Plymouth, Garden City and Northville -- are accepted first at resident student rates of \$10 per semester hour.

Non-district residents are accepted as vacancies permit at \$18 per semester hour. Most courses are rated at three semester hours of credit, with some of two credit hours and some of five credit hours.

Most classes start at 7 p.m. Some start at 6 p.m. and others

between then and 9 p.m.

APPRENTICE, tradesmen, journeymen and selected trainee courses for industrial employes are offered one evening a week by arrangement with the college apprenticeship coordinator; telephone 591-6400, ext. 301.

Michigan State University graduate course offerings are available also by arrangement; telephone 591-6400, ext. 345 for the teacher education center.

On the winter evening classes catalog just released, the college administration spelled out its attitude in making the offerings:

"Your Future Depends on You -- You Depend on Your Education."

5 Names Sought As SC President

A search committee to seek a replacement for Schoolcraft College President Eric Bradner when he retires at the end of June 1970, will be charged with presenting five persons for Board of Trustees final selection consideration.

This much has been determined in the trustees' charge to the prospective search committee. Other details have not yet been resolved.

A board committee hopes for confirmation next month of their suggestion that the search committee be composed of seven members representing the board spectrum of college groups.

They recommend one member each for the faculty, administration, students, building foundation, and alumni, and

two to represent the board. Approval of this recommendation was bypassed at the November meeting for lack of a required sixth vote.

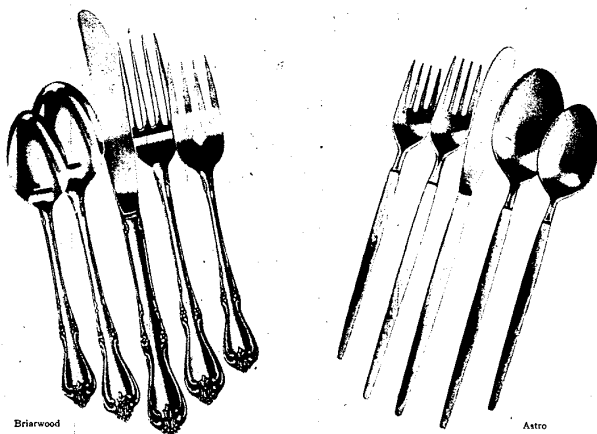
