Don't confuse the Spanish food with the hot dishes of Mexico. Even those on diets survived

very well on the delicacies of Spain. If you are not used to it, the odd taste in the foods, scrambled eggs as well as vegetables, is the olive oil. The wines of the country are excellent as are the seafoods.

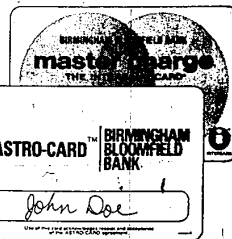

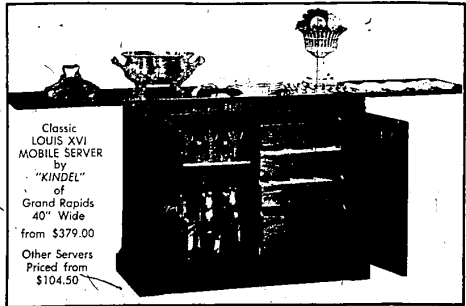
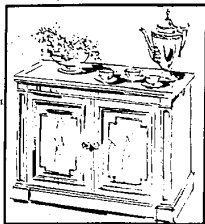
