Junebug's Shutter Stays Active In Military

FARMINGTON Junebug Clark of Farmington may be in the Marines, but he still carries a civilian camera. Clark and camera are a two-some that has been going most of Clark's 20 years.

HE IS the son of Joe and Bernice Clark of 30419 Twelve Mile. It's a photographic family. Mother has been a fashion photographer; father is a free-lance magazine photographer. The letterhead for the Clark photographic studio in Oak Park carries the names "Joe, Bernice, Junebug."

A 1968 graduate of North Farmington High and now a Marine lance corporal at the Santa Ana helicopter station, Clark recently entered 13 photos in the Pacific Area Marine Corps photography contest and won 12 awards.

The awards, included: best of show, best of black and white, first and third place in military life, third in scenic, third in experimental, and so on.

Clark has been taking pictures since he was three.

He had to wait until he was five before he got his first break, when one of his photos was selected for a beer advertisement. It seems his father was shooting for the ad and he let Junebug play around with one of the cameras.

JUNEBUG took a picture of his mother drinking a glass of beer and the advertising executive said that was the one he wanted.

A year later, at age six, Junebug shot a story for American Motors. He was a trifle young, but the company gave him a new Rambler with the title in his name.

While still a child, Junebug wrote articles for a Detroit newspaper before he was forced to quit -- child labor laws.

He attended Ferris State College and the Rochester Institute of Technology a little later in life and studied in the Marines for three years in October 1968.

Wherever he goes when his Marine hitch is up, the camera is certain to go also.

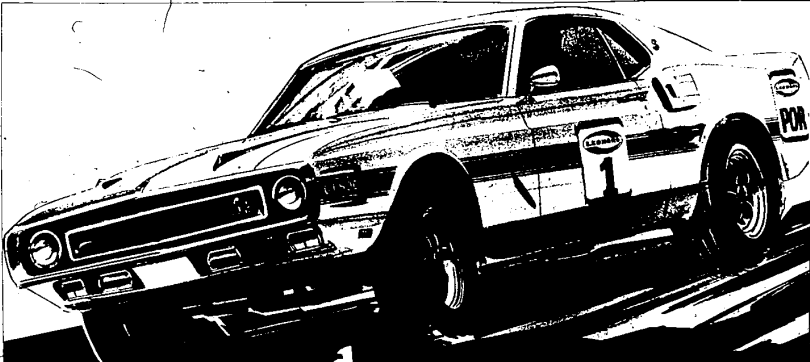
