Area equestrians prepare for show

Four lovely equestrians from Birmingham, Farmington, Hartland and Webberville will be in the spotlight when the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club begins competition Friday, June 8 in its annual series of three back-to-back horse shows.

Before the curtain falls Sunday, June 24, nearly 700 horses from at least 16 states in this country will have competed for a share of a record \$68,000 in

prize money in the three days of the Detroit Dressage Show, the five days of the Motor City Horse Show and the six days of the Detroit Horse Show.

Also expected to be on hand are a number of Canadian entries, including several hopefuls for the Canadian Olympic Equestrian Team who will match mounts over the jumps with their American Olympic counterparts. The dressage competition which will

be featured on the opening weekend, June 8, 9, 10, emphasizes a traditional equestrian art in which horses are judged on their execution of a complex series of maneuvers signaled only by slight cues from the rider's hands, legs and waist.

Back to defend her Col. I. L. Kils Memorial Trophy, which she won last year, will be Dee Ann Cramer of Webberville, a gymnastics teacher in Lansing.

The glamour set, the height-scaling hunters and jumpers which carry the greater box office appeal, will take over after that during the Motor City

Show June 13-17 and the climactic Detroit Show June 19-24.

Peak interest will come with the staging of the North American Grand Prix for open jumpers, which will be offered the evening of Friday, June 22. It will carry a record prize package of \$15,000 as opposed to the \$10,000 at stake last year.

General admission prices are \$2 day-times and \$3 evenings. The BOH grounds, where there is parking for 7,000 cars, are on East Long Lake Road, less than a mile east of Woodward in Bloomfield Hills.

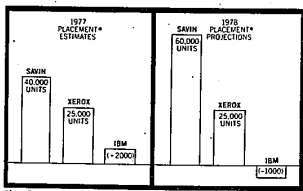
