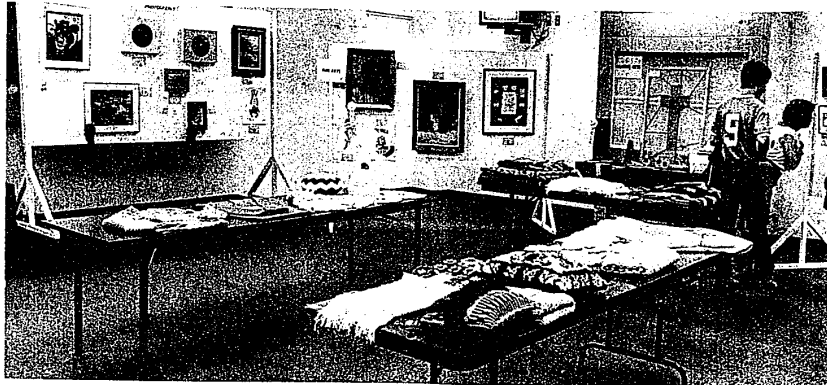




Eleanor Nelson won a third place for her entries in the textile category of the Botsford General Hospital arts and craft show. (Staff photo)

School lunch program debated by trustees

would be based on the total enrollment of the school rather than the number of children eating school lunches.

Copies of the Board's resolution were sent to Campbell, State Rep. Wilbur (Sandy) Brotherton, R-Farmington, and the MASH.

SHIPCE called the resolution an attempt to kill the breakfast program.

"We're getting into the middle of a hornet's nest. Even if we are against the breakfast program, this is not a wise resolution to adopt," he said.

"We've gone through the issue twice already. On one side, we have the school boards, the chamber of commerce and MASH. On the other side are social welfare groups, the UAW and the liberals. The same side is going to win again. We should use our lobby with something more important."

"Some people who are really against

the mandatory breakfast program — not the criteria — are supporting this resolution," he continued.

"It's not based on good criteria. There could be 50 or 75 kids who get free lunches in school, but that school still wouldn't be required to have a breakfast program."

Assistant Superintendent Larry Freedman defended the school administration's position.

"We're not against feeding kids who need food," he said. "Our main concern is changing the criteria to keep in mind the percentage of students who bring brown bag lunches."

"COUNTING ONLY those served free lunches does not have equity. We think the criteria is unfair."

"The program would have impact district-wide. We would have to bring youngsters to school earlier so they could be served breakfast if they so desired."
