SHPIECE CALLED the resolution an attempt to kill the breakfast program.

"We're getting into the middle of a hornets' nest. Even if we are against the breakfast program, this is not a wise resolution to adopt," he saw a diready. need food," he said. "Our main concern
is changing the criteria to keep in mind
the percentage of students who bring
brown bag lunches.

"COUNTING ONLY those served free lunches does not have equity. We think the criteria is unfair.
"The program would have impact district-wide. We would have to bring youngsters to school earlier so they could be served breakfast if they so desired.


