Parent Wants Top Priority For School Transportation

FARMINGTON
The president of the West Franklin Estates Association thinks expanding busing ought to be a top priority budget item for the Farmington School District.

Sheldon Slavin, while urging additional busing of pupils to Bond Elementary School, suggested the Farmington school board should re-evaluate its transportation program and consider adding more routes.

The board's safety committee is, currently studying a request from Slavin to bus about 14 students who must walk between a mile and 1 1/2 miles to Bond School.

THE CHILDREN presently walk on a path which cuts through a wooded area, said Slavin. Use of the path is not safe, he said, because children may be threatened by strangers.

The walkway was installed by the school district to satisfy parents after the school board decided a year ago against busing those children living within a mile and a half of the school.

(The district does not receive any state aid for transportation for any child it buses within a mile and a half.)

But Slavin says the parents never wanted the walkway. "The majority of the parents were surprised and infuriated when they found out that a pathway was in existence. The community of West Franklin Estates was never approached on this subject," he said.

"There are other subdivisions which due to platting are constricted. We do not have streets and roads that many of the newer subdivisions have," he continued, "and this presents a serious walking problem for youngsters of elementary school age."

SLAVIN WOULD LIKE the school board to consider busing children living within a mile from the school, instead of the mile and a half limit. He noted Livonia uses a mile yardstick and has better streets than the township.

"In a random sampling of school districts," Slavin said, "it was found that in Berkley there are no buses, in Allen Park most students do not have to walk more than 2 miles to school, in Southfield and Birmingham the yardstick is one mile, and in Bloomfield

Hills it is one-half mile.

"Find out how many requests (for busing if a mile limit was used) would actually be made and why. I would suggest that we do some public relations work with the community. Perhaps there isn't a problem; perhaps there is. It is a serious problem, then it is a serious problem, then it is a serious problem, then it is a serious problem."

"I value a child's life and I am not afraid of Pandora's box," Slavin concludes. "Our hope is that the board will realize our particular set of conditions which have forced us to make this request."
