## Chamber music series continued at Schoolcraft

The chamber music series at Schoolcraft College presents the second of its three concerts at 8 p.m. Tuesday.

These programs, held in the Liberal Arts Theater on the campus, offer performances by the Summer Music School faculty, which is drawn from members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and the college's Music Department.

Thursday's concert will consist of three compositions — one from the baroque period, one classical and one of the 20th century.

DSO cellist Debra Fayrolin will present Vach's Suite No. 3 in C Major for unaccompanied cello. The six movements of the suite, while giving the impression of light-hearted gaiety, provide an extreme technical challenge to the virtuoso capabilities of the performer who must provide all the melody, harmony and counterpoint without the help of any accompanying instruments.

From the classic era, clarinetist Oliver Green, violist Meyer Shapiro and pianist Robert W. Jones will perform Mozart's colorful Trio for Clarinet, Viola and Piano. The unusual combination of these three instruments gives warmth and personal color to Mozart's highly polished style.

After intermission, Dr. Derek Francis and Donald Morelock will present the complex and difficult Sonata No. 2 in D Major for Violin and Piano by the 20th century Russian composer, Sergei Prokofiev. The work is unusual since the composer originally created the violin part for flute but was encouraged to rewrite the solo at the insistence of Russian violinist David Oistrakh.

General admission to the concert is \$2 with a student and senior citizen admission also available for \$1. Schoolcraft College is located at 19600 Hagerty in Livonia.
