## 'Steambath' plays extra show dates

"Steambath," Bruce Jay Friedman's outrageous comedy in which the limbo between life and death is examined by God (a Puerto Rican janitor) and members of the Steambath, will be the summer feature on the Detroit's Attie Theatre stage, continuing through Sept. 1.

Because of the normally sold-out houses on Saturday, Lavinia Moyer, artistic director of the Attie Theatre, has announced that the one 8 p.m. performance will be replaced by a show at 6 p.m. and one at 9 p.m. on Saturday only.

Herbert Ferrer returns to the Attie stage as Morty, the Puerto Rican janitor, recreating the role he portrayed earlier this year at Lansing's Board-Head Theater. In his Attie debut will be John Beem as Tandy. Mr. Beem is a master graduate of WSU's Hilberry Theatre where he most recently was seen in "Butley" and "How the Other Half Loves."

Mrs. Moyer also announced that the previously scheduled production of "Gemini" will be replaced by Lanford Wilson's "5th of July," Sept. 7-Oct. 13. The next season of the Attie Theatre and its second subscription series — will be announced this summer.

## Sign Singers to sing Tuesday

Carol Morrison, formerly of Bloomfield Hills, will direct the Wisconsin Sign Singers in a concert at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 31, in the First Congregational Church of Royal Oak.

The hour-long performance will be presented by a group of deaf and hearing individuals interested in promoting deaf awareness as well as providing an entertaining program for deaf and hearing audiences.

The sign singers came together in 1977 to put on a Christmas concert in sign language. The response was so enthusiastic that since that time, the group has performed almost weekly at churches and clubs in the Wisconsin area.

The original Christmas carols have been replaced with a variety of rock

gospel and popular songs. They are performed in sign language as the music is heard.

Ms. Morrison, a Lahser High School graduate, received her degree from Michigan State University in 1976. She is teaching the hearing impaired in Kenosha, Wis., and has already earned her certification as a teacher of the hearing impaired.

This summer she studied at Gallaudet College for the deaf in Washington, D.C. Her sister, Janet Morrison, is also involved with programs for the deaf at the Church of Christ of Troy.

On Tuesday, July 31, the sign singers will perform from 1-3 p.m. in Twelve-Oaks Mall, Novi. The First Congregational Church in Royal Oak is on Crooks between 12 and 13 Mile, just south of Webster.

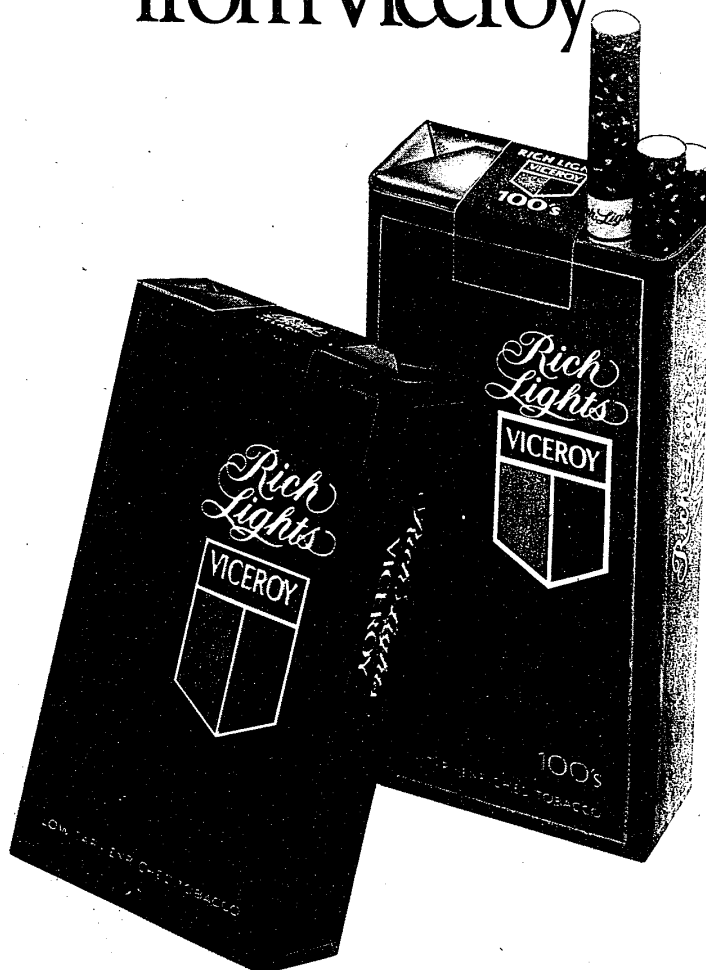
