3. Only one golfer won the **PGA Championship** and the **British Open** in the same year. Who was he?

4. **Holes-in-one** are rare and wonderful occurrences in golf. There have been a number of **holes-in-one** since the **PGA Championship** began in 1916. See if you can guess the number of golfers who

scored aces. Now that you have a number, name at least half of those golfers.

9. The same person who has won the most **PGA Championships** has also won the most consecutive titles. How many?

10. Four golfers have each been the runner-up in the **PGA Championship** three times. Name the three golfers.

11. Who was the oldest person to win the **PGA** and what was his age?

12. Two golfers were fortunate enough to win the **PGA Championship** at the tender age of 20. Name the golfers.

Weiskopf trims tour schedule

Tom Weiskopf earned more than \$100,000 in 1978 for the eighth consecutive year, but made less money than he had in any season since 1971. One factor was his reduced playing schedule: Weiskopf entered 20 events in 1978, compared to 23 in 1977 and 27 in 1976.

Weiskopf snared his 13th **PGA** tour victory last year, besting fellow Ohioan Jack Nicklaus in a searing duel in the **Doral-Eastern Open**. Paired with Nicklaus for the 36-hole finale, (caused by a Thursday rainout) Weiskopf took the lead with a third-round 67 that put him two strokes ahead of his closest pursuers and four in front of Nicklaus.

Both played the front side of the final 18 in 35, but Nicklaus scorched

the back nine with two eagles and a pair of birdies for a six-under 30 that gave him a 65 for the round.

But Weiskopf was equal to the challenge, responding with a 33 for a finishing 68 that held off Nicklaus by one stroke.

Other than **Doral**, Weiskopf enjoyed his best 1978 finishes in the **U.S. Open** and the **PGA Championship**. He tied for fourth in both events.

In 1977, Weiskopf won the **Kemper Open** for the third time, closing with a two-under 70 that turned back **Bill Rogers** and **George Burns** by two shots. That victory began a torrid four-week stretch in June in which Weiskopf also tied for fourth at **Memphis**, placed third in the **U.S. Open** and gained a solo fourth in the

Western Open.

Long regarded as one of the most talented players on the tour, Weiskopf proved in one dazzling spell in 1973 that he was capable of reaching unusual heights. During eight weeks that spring and summer he won five tournaments, including the **British** and **Canadian Opens**. Carrying over to two other tournaments, he shot in the 60s in exactly half of his 40 rounds.

Later in 1973, Weiskopf also won the **World Series of Golf** and the **South African PGA Championship**. Although failing to win in 1974, Weiskopf passed the \$1 million barrier in career earnings and finished in the top 10 in nine of 21 events. In 1975 he was a winner again and easily topped \$200,000 for the second time.






