North Students Must Sign Up Now For Merit Scholarships

North Farmington High students who expect to enter col-

lege in 1991 can register now to participate in the 1990-91 National Merit Scholarship program.

Principal Clayton Graham says the first step to enter the nationwide scholarship contest is to take the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMQST).

The test will be given at NFHS at 9 a.m. Feb. 14. Students may register to take the test in Graham's office between now and Dec. 19.

TAKING THE NMQST is also the first step for students who wish to participate in other scholarship programs administered by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). These programs include the National Achievement Scholarship Program for outstanding Negro students and special scholarship programs administered by NMSC for business and industrial firms.

NMQST participants pay a \$125 test fee. When the test is given on a Saturday, the school may charge an additional fee of up to \$125 to cover administrative costs of testing on a nonschool day. If an unusually promising student is unable to pay the \$125 test fee, it will be paid by NMSC at the principal's request.

When his NMQST scores are reported, each participating student will receive a handbook to help him understand his scores and compare his test performance with that of other high school students across the country.
