Hearing Set On Theatre

Plans are in the mill for construction of a theatre seating 900 customers on the west side of Orchard Lake Rd., about 750 feet north of 12 Mile Rd. Eugene Sloan, the developer, says the theatre will be named "Old Orchard Theatre" and will be a part of the Suburban Detroit Theatre Corp. which operates the Mercury, Radio City, Terrace, Gateway and Village Theatres.

Sloan appeared before the Farmington Township Planning Commission Tuesday night requesting rezoning from residential to commercial. He told commissioners the side of the building will face Orchard Lake Rd. and plans call for one parking space for every three customers.

Rest Home Staff Units Approved

Farmington Township Planning commissioners Tuesday night approved site plans for apartments on a 33-acre parcel at Tuck and Freedom Rds. to house the staff of the convalescent home on Tuck.

Plans call for 21 apartments to be built for employees of the home, which was formerly the Children's Hospital and is presently being remodeled.

In less than five minutes, the volunteers arrived in the emergency van and supplied oxygen. Woodie was revived after being worked on for 30-45 minutes.
