NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Assessment District Road No. 392, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Oakland County, Court House, Pontiac, Michigan, until 1:30 o'clock p. m., Central Standard Time, Thursday, June 9th, 1921, by Frank F. Rogers State Highway Commissioner, for the improving of 8.637 miles of road in Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, located as follows:—

Commencing at the north section corner common to sections 26 and 27, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County; thence south on the section line between sections 26-27 and fractional sections 34-35 to the south section corner common to said fractional sections 34 and 35; thence east on the section line between fractional sections 35 and 36, town 1 north, range 8 east, Novi Township, Oakland County and fractional sections 2 and 1, town 1 south, range 8 east, Northville Township, Wayne County to the east section corner common to said fractional sections 2 and 1; thence continuing east on the County line between fractional sections 31, 32 and 33, town 1 north, range 9 east, Farmington Township, Oakland County, and fractional sections 5 and 4, town 1 south, range 9 east, Livonia Township, Wayne County to the south section corner common to fractional sections 33 and 34 of said Farmington Township; thence north on the section line between fractional sections 33-34 and sections 27-28 to its intersection with the Grand River Road in the Village of Farmington.

The work will consist of shaping the road, constructing the necessary drainage structures and surfacing as follows:—

Section 1: 0.56 miles of 12 ft. gravel (Trunk Line Specifications).

Section 2: 1.68 miles of 18 ft. to 46 ft. concrete or bituminous concrete in Farmington Township.

Plans may be examined and instructions to bidders, specifications and proposal blanks obtained at the office of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Oakland County, Court House, Pontiac, Michigan; at the district office of the State Highway Department, No. 1-2 Majestic Building, Port Huron, Michigan; and at the office of the State Highway Department, Lansing, Michigan. Plans will be furnished by the undersigned upon the receipt of a deposit of five (\$5.00) dollars, which will be refunded upon their safe return.

This road is to be built under direction of the State Highway Department, funds being secured by the sale of Bonds based on a tax upon a special assessment district and upon the townships of Novi and Farmington in Oakland County, and Northville and Livonia in Wayne County, and upon the counties of Oakland and Wayne at large.

Bids at unit prices will be received for either section complete or both section together.

A certified check in the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars made payable to Frank F. Rogers, State Highway Commissioner, must accompany each proposal, for each section.
