move. The park jumped ahead fast. "The need for assessment of this millage became unnecessary. We were able to stop assessing the millage because the park was paying its own way. This became very valuable tax base. You gambled and you won, now the city wants to steal your winnings - don't let them."

NOLAN THEN turned his attention to the rejection of the incorporation petition, saying: "I find the action of the Boundary Commission deplorable. "The commission is new, the law is new, but the intent of the petition is very clear. They ask to make one city out of the township and two villages. Incorporate-consolidate-I don't care what they call it, the intent is the same. "If the Boundary Commission has one ounce of fairness, it will accept the substitute petition and let us decide our own fate. We are the ones who have worked hard and pledged our money to develop our community. We should have the courage to keep that which we worked hard to develop."

NOLAN TOOK exception with a statement of Irving Rozian, state-appointed commissioner, that the circulators knew the difference between incorporation and consolidation.

"No, Mr. Rozian, I don't agree with you. The law is new, the steps taken by these citizens were exactly what they should have been under the old law. They are not professionals, Mr. Rozian, just citizens fighting to save what is theirs. They have proved their intentions by the substitute petitions.

"If the Boundary Commission knocks them down for the sake of one word, then I will have no respect for the Boundary Commission.

"What can you do, Mr. Average Citizen? Get up and fight," suggests Nolan. "Write the governor-write the Boundary Commission-pledge your support. I will work if you will. Contact township hall and leave your name."

BIRMINGHAM
Farmington high school students will have an opportunity to tour Europe as participants in a "Summer School Abroad" program sponsored by South Oakland Educators.
