THE BEST MEN IN DEMAND.

John McGraw, manager of the  
New York Giants, has paid \$75-  
000 for Jimmy O'Connell, an un-  
usually promising young player of  
the San Francisco baseball club.  
O'Connell's salary is not mention-  
ed in the dispatches, but it will be

high beyond doubt.

Baseball, which is merely a sport  
for most of us, is a career for a  
chosen few, and a highly lucrative  
one. But there is money in base-  
ball only for the top-notchers.  
Only those who can play the  
game a great deal better than the  
rank and file get big salaries.

And this is true of any business  
or profession. The man who ex-  
cels is the man who gets to the  
top, whether it is baseball, or the  
law, or merchandising, or manu-  
facturing, or bartering, or shoe-  
making.

There is always more jobs to be  
filled than there are men capable  
of filling them, but the mediocre  
fellows, are always a drag on the  
market at any price.

#### WHAT WAR COSTS.

Four hundred and sixty-three  
thousand men, working for \$2,000 a  
year, earn just enough in a year

to pay the interest on our national  
debt, says a statistician.  
This tells the story of the cost  
of war.

expressed in long money figures.  
Transported into terms of human  
labor, its evil is clearly seen.

Human labor is the only wealth.  
It pays for every war, long after  
the guns are rusted into dust.

#### STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE

Authorities at the University of  
Michigan are constantly on the  
alert to protect and preserve the  
health of the large number of  
students in attendance.

Dr. Warren G. Forsythe, direct-  
or of the University Health Ser-  
vice, has introduced the "Schick  
test," that enables him to deter-  
mine whether a person is immune  
to diphtheria, and is devoting one  
afternoon a week to students who  
care to take the test. Those  
found subject to diphtheria can be

made immune by three weekly  
injections.

Dr. John Sundwall, director of  
the newly created Department of  
Physical Welfare, is making plans  
for a student health center—not a  
regular hospital, but a place ad-  
apted to caring for students who  
are ill, where they will be en-  
couraged to come for prompt and  
efficient treatment. Disclosure of  
definite plans will not be made,  
pending further appropriations  
from the state, but it is hoped that  
within a short time arrangements  
for handling student health prob-  
lems will be made even more per-  
fect than at present.

As a further move in the cam-  
paign to have every student en-  
gage in some form of physical ac-  
tivity to promote health, the Uni-  
versity intra-mural office has com-  
pleted arrangements with the  
management of a local ice-rink,  
whereby the rink will open to all  
students for three hours every af-  
ternoon.
