Reset Carburetor and Save Battery

It Will Conserve Cuss Words And Is Cheaper in the Long Run.

These are the mornings when the average motorist gives his vocabulary of profanity a thorough try-out.

Cool mornings when the thermometer is hovering a few degrees above the freezing mark, cause air about the family garage to become possessed of an azure hue.

Mr. Motorist steps on his starter pedal and the motor turns over a few times, but so far as starting is concerned there is nothing doing.

But "There's a Reason!"

The Willard Storage Battery Company of Cleveland, says this is the worst season of the year on a battery. This is the season when the motorist is suffering from a congested carburetor. He has not adjusted this most important part of the car to winter condition. The mixture of gas with which he tries to start the engine is the same as that which was used all summer. It's too lean and will not ignite. The longer the driver holds down the starting pedal the more current he is using from the battery and after a morning or two of such doings the battery will need recharging.

It's far better, to adjust the carburetor and save the battery—and it's cheaper in the long run.

WATCH STEERING MECHANISM

Car Whose Direction Cannot Be Controlled Is Dangerous—Make Frequent Inspections.

Don't neglect your steering mechanisms. A car whose direction cannot be controlled is dangerous. While adjusting mechanism it is best to turn wheels to extreme right. Parts are worn less at this position than when straight ahead. Never turn the steering wheel while the car is standing still. This puts severe strain on all steering gear parts and is hard on tires. Careful drivers will inspect frequently.

PREVENT MISSES OF ENGINE

Do Not Neglect Manifold, and If Spark Plug Is Not Tight Trouble Will Follow.

Don't neglect your manifold. If you have a spark plug which is not screwed tight, or a petcock partly open, or a gasket which is not absolutely air-tight, your engine will misbehave when you try to make it pull at slow speed on a hill. To find air leaks squirt a little oil around the plug or gasket and if bubbles show up you have a leak.

WASHING CAR IS NOT CASUAL JOB

Cleansing Should Be Done Immediately After Dirt Is Discovered on Surface.

MUD IS HARD TO ELIMINATE

Water Should Be About 50 Degrees Fahrenheit and a Sponge Used—Soap Is Bad Except for Removing Grease or Oil Spots.

Washing the car is not the casual job some owners seem to imagine. To begin with, the car should be washed immediately after it has been made dirty. If mud is allowed to remain on the varnished surface more than a day, it is difficult to eradicate it. For the washing, plain water should be used, neither too cold nor too hot, about 50 degrees F being the proper temperature.

A large sponge soaked in clear water and then sopped against the surface so that the water trickles down is best. Never turn a stream of water at high pressure on the body. This will grind thick particles of sand and other grit into the varnish to the detriment of the finish. The idea is to float the mud or dirt off the surface.

Soap is Injurious.

Soap should never be used on the body except for removing grease or oil spots. A small piece of soft cloth, well covered with castile soap suds, serves very well to remove grease from the panels. The food should never be washed while it is hot, as this will result in discoloration. In cleaning the radiator send a stream of water from the rear instead of the front, to keep moisture out of the mechanism.

In drying the body a clean chamois skin should be used, rubbing being done in straight lines. If spots of tar or road oil are found on the body, it is best to treat them with soft butter or kerosene. The butter softens the deposit so that it may be wiped off easily. Kerosene should be applied locally and wiped off with a minute.

To keep pace with the improved appearance of the body it is necessary to give some attention to the top and the upholstery. A weekly brushing of the top inside and out will aid materially in its life. Fabric tops should never be cleaned with gasoline, kerosene or other oils, as they tend to destroy the rubber in the top. Castile soap and water applied with a stiff brush is the best cleansing medium for the top.

Clean With Cloths.

After the dust has been removed, leather upholstery may be cleaned with a cloth soaked in a weak solution of ammonia and water. Castile soap and water are also good on leather, but gasoline should not be employed, because it tends to cause cracking. The leather should be treated occasionally by giving it a light coating of linseed oil thinned with kerosene. The solution should be applied with a cloth and be allowed to remain for a few hours.

The present-day owner using modern methods may keep his car looking new all the time, but will he have to spend more than a few minutes a day to accomplish this end. For instance there are now on the market a number of liquid wax polishes which will give admirable results if they are used as directed.

In the use of wax polishes the first step is to clean the body of the car thoroughly. The polish is applied to the surface with a piece of cheese cloth, and then another clean cloth is used to distribute the wax evenly all over the surface. Car owners commonly make the mistake of thinking that the more wax applied the better.

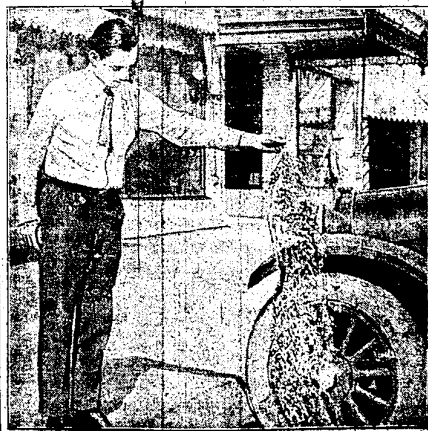
