The deposit collects very rapidly, sepacially when the grade of all used is poor or too much oil is used. It also results when the carbourter is adjusted to give too rich a mixture.

Openings Become Clogged. When these small openings become clogged the exhaust gases cannot escape readily, and naturally the cylinder of the engine is not cleaned at the exhaust stroke. Result: It is impossible to bring in a full cylinder of new gas on the next intake stroke. There is not a full tharge to explode, and this means a loss of power to the encine.

As a boy with a dirty face puts off the cleaning up process just as long as possible, so, the motorist with a muffler that needs attention procressitates and thinks perhaps he will fix it up tomorrow, and tomorrow never comes. It is therefore often neglected or misused. And yet it ought not to be. The muffler is placed on the end of the exhaust plue of the engine so that the driver of an automobile while taking pleasure himself does not wholly deprive others of it. Let us consider the use of the muffler. The exhaust valve opens while the burned gas is still under a pressure for not 25 to 30 pounds per square linch. If this were exhausted directly into the air the resulting noise would stifle conversation for the car, annoy everybody along the street and quickly get the driver into trouble with the police. The muffler prevents all this. It provides a chamber in which these exhaust guses may expand and cool somewhat and at the same time breaks up the pressure by allowing it to leak out though a number of yery small holes, instead of letting it loose to one "big noise."

Now that cold weather is here, you should look your battery over every two weeks. These few simple instructions, faithfully followed, will lengthen the life of a battery:

1. Don't lay tools or snything olde or top of your battery.

2. Don't spin your engine several minutes at a time.

3. If your engine does not start promptly, see that 's sgallion switch is on and the carb' or instrure sufficiently rich better using starter again.

4. See that eagl is sufficiently primed in cold wes are. Throw your syltch off; push si 'eter to ture engine once or twice; hrow switch on; then start again an 'your cylinder is primed.

5. If your car is nds idle for a mouth or more, tak the battery out and leave it at the sivice station.

6. Use nothing but itstilled water.

7. Let an expert dd the acid for the electrolyte.

8. When the solption sprays or spills, whee clean with a moist aponge. Some batteries make no provision to keep the solution from splashing, so this rule is given.

9. Keep metal.




