## Hold Hearing Monday On Downtown Plans

FARMINGTON A public hearing will be held Monday in City Council chambers on the proposed Central Business District (CBD) zoning regulations.

The CBD zoning amendments are intended to provide an impetus for redeveloping the city's downtown business district which includes the area bounded by Oakland, Alta Loma, Liberty and Maple.

THE DRAFT of the ordinance, prepared by the city's planning consultants Draker & Associates, has been revised

slightly. The changes will be explained during Monday's hearing which starts at 8 p.m. The ordinance, when adopted, will limit commercial uses in the CBD to basically office and general retail. The regulations restrict business uses which are not compatible or would not upgrade the downtown area.

The city has already met with downtown merchants and discussed the proposed regulations. Written notices of the Jan. 5 hearing were also sent to merchants.

The ordinance amendment envisions for the downtown area types of business uses which will encourage the movement of pedestrian shoppers.

BECAUSE THERE is a limited amount of land available for development downtown, some uses are excluded from the CBD, such as industrial, residential, warehousing and storage uses. These uses will be allowed in other districts in the city.

Among the principal permitted uses are: medical clinics, photographic studios, professional offices, municipal buildings, food, drug and book stores, service shops, florist, restaurants, cleaners, department stores, banks, and a variety of retail shops.

The draft specified taverns will be allowed as long as total gross sales of food exceeds 50%.

This provision may be altered Jan. 5. The regulations also provide there shall be no outdoor or indoor storage of goods beyond what is incidental to permitted use of the business.

Among the uses prohibited in the CBD in the ordinance are: service stations, car wash, car dealers, bump shops, vehicle rental uses, trailer rental firms, drive-in restaurants, coin-operated laundries, bowling alleys, skating rinks, lumberyards, miniature golf or trampolines.

Any business use not listed under permitted uses may be approved by the Board of Zoning Appeals which will have authority to issue special exception permits.

Maximum building height in the CBD will be three stories or 35 feet.
