**Michigan Wool Prices**

Highest in Two Years

Michigan wool prices reached a new high point for the past two years June 1 when Michigan Delaines were quoted at 51 cents f. o. b. Lansing, with lower grades shaded a cent or two down the list to rejection at 33 cents, said the state farm bureau. Wool consumers are still scrambling for wool, said the bureau. South American stocks have been cleaned up and comparatively little is coming into this country from overseas. According to the May business conditions report of the Chicago Federal Reserve bank the price paid many producers is about 100 per cent better than in April 21. The tariff situation, scarcity of good grades of wool, advancing foreign markets and recent improvements in the woollens industry are factors that are adding strength to the market the Reserve bank report said.

The farm bureau will begin meeting at 37 points in the Thumb district June 19, advancing forty per cent to the growers. The bureau practically completed second payment of its ten thousand 1921 accounts this week.
