## Engaged

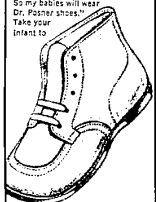

## 'Heart Of Gold' Luncheon Planning Now Underway

Will it be roses, forsythia, jonquils or cherry blossoms? That question is uppermost in the minds of Mrs. Joseph L. Hudson Jr., chairman, and Mrs. Aaron Gershenson, vice chairman, for the third annual "Heart of Gold" awards luncheon honoring outstanding women volunteers.

The two have been busy with luncheon centerpiece plans while other Detroit area homemakers concentrated on holly, mistletoe and Yule ornaments.

Mrs. Hudson and Mrs. Gershenson expect more than 2,000 Wayne - Oakland - Macomb women to join them at the luncheon scheduled for 11:45 a.m. Feb. 10 in Cobo Hall.

THEY ARE issuing invitations on behalf of the Heart of Gold Award Council formed in 1967 to provide recognition for volunteers who give their time and talents to community betterment.

The council is comprised of 42 leading women's organizations working with Women for the United Foundation (WUF), itself a volunteer group involved in year-round activities for the U.F.

Open to the public, the awards luncheon will salute from six to 12 outstanding volunteers who symbolize those working without pay in community agencies and organizations.

## Don't Take Chances With Strep Throat, Physician Warns

Onset of the strep throat season means parents and physicians should be especially careful to check all sore throats in children by means of the relatively inexpensive throat culture test.

The warning comes from Dr. Edward L. Quinn, chairman of the Rheumatic Fever Control Committee of the Michigan Heart Association, who said the test should be administered to all children with a sore throat or who have been exposed to a strep infection.

Few diseases can be cured as easily as strep, which is invariably susceptible to a full course of antibiotics," explained Dr. Quinn, who is the director of the Department of Infectious Disease, Henry Ford Hospital, in Detroit.

"Strep throat, or its counterpart, scarlet fever, are the only known causes of rheumatic fever, itself a difficult disease which can also damage the heart valves."

"THERE ARE a number of reasons, however, why the unnecessary use of antibiotics should be avoided," Dr. Quinn added. "This is why we advocate the throat culture. Most laboratories and health departments will culture a throat swab sample and return a verdict within a day or two."

"When the presence of strep is properly diagnosed by culture, there is little danger that there will be inadequate or needless treatment."

Active rheumatic fever (RF), which used to be a very large killer of children, caused the deaths of eight last year, according to the records of the Michigan Department of Public Health. Rheumatic heart disease (RHD), however, caused the deaths of 710 persons, ranging in age from 25 to 90. The highest group of fatalities, 221, occurred among persons between 55 and 64 years of age.
