For Grads, Job Outlook Dims

City Chiefs Set Area Meeting)

Wayne County members of the Michigan Municipal League will gather Jan. 15 in the Mayflower Meeting House to hear a four-point program presented by guest speakers.

First on the program will be the proposed state-wide hous-ing and building code. The speaker, Donald Henderson, is the chairman of the governor's committee studying the codes in the state.

The question of county-wide property assessing will be discussed by guest speaker L. Hart Wright from the University of Michigan Law School.

Municipal public relations also is scheduled on the agenda of the afternoon session. Hershel Fink from the Detroit News will be guest speaker.

Running concurrent with the public relations program will be an intergovernmental cooperation discussion lead by William Ostenson of the South-leastern Michigan Transit Authority (SEMTA).

Representatives from Region III include city and village officials from the 23 communities in Wayne County. The league is made up of 10 regions throughout the state, but due to the size of the Wayne County group it comprises one complete region.

"THE LARGEST percentage increase in salaries will go to graduates in accounting and finance." Shingleton says. "They will receive approximately an a top 59- tike." He adds, business and engineering graduates will probably receive only 3 to 4% increase. Which is less than in the last three years. Liberal arts graduates can expect a 3% increase.

The group hardest hit by the decreasing a validability of jobs and the fall in salary increases are the Ph.D. candidates.

"THE SALARIES for Ph.D graduates will increase very little because of all the groups

this is one where the demand has been reduced appreciably. Students can expect only about a 2% increase in salaries."

Generally, students receiv-ing a bachelor's degree will receive only a 3 to 4% increase and those earning master's degrees will realize 5 to 6% in-creases.

"The reason increases are dimishing is because there is a 'compression' problem. The

employers have increased the starting rates greatly in the past. At the same time, how-ever, they have not increased the rates for old employes.

"MANY EMPLOYERS tend to relieve this by cutting down on the percentage of in-crease," Shingleton explained.

Even more important, quo-tas have been cut back for most major corporations.
