Urban Study Grant To WSU

The Center for Urban Studies at Wayne State University has announced a \$90,000 grant for study of the social and economic trends that underlie the quality of urban living. The long-range hope is to develop indicators useful in understanding and predicting social change in urban areas, with particular emphasis on Detroit.

WSU President William R. Keast accepted the initial \$30,000 payment from George W. Miller, president of De-

troit's Bank of the Commons, which operates 49 of its 57 branches within the inner city. The bank will contribute an additional \$60,000 to the project in 1970 and expects to continue annual support in subsequent years.

One of the projects under consideration will involve the compilation of data dealing with societal indicators for the SEMCOG region (Southeast Michigan Council of Governments) and the analysis of that information.

Math Teacher Institutes Set

The University of Detroit has received three grants totaling \$158,500 from the National Science Foundation to support three institutes for high school mathematics teachers during the 1970 summer and 1970-71 academic year.

The three institutes at U. of D. include:

1. An academic year Institute for Teachers of Mathe-

matics in Inner City High Schools which will provide a master's degree program for 15 experienced high school mathematics teachers. The institute will begin in the summer session of 1970 and continue throughout the 1970-71 academic year.

Participants will receive a tax exempt stipend of \$3,450, an allowance of \$540 per dependent for up to a maximum

of four dependents, a text book allowance of \$75 and a mileage allowance. Complete applications are due at U. of D. by Jan. 20, 1970.

2. A Summer Institute for high school teachers of mathematics will provide an opportunity for 55 experienced high school teachers to take two courses during the 1970 summer session from June 22 to July 21, which will apply toward the degree of master of arts in the teaching of mathematics.

Each teacher will receive a stipend of \$450 if he lives on

campus, or \$400 if he lives off-campus, and an allowance of \$90 per dependent for up to a maximum of four dependents. The deadline for completed applications is Feb. 15, 1970. The total amount of the grant is \$44,250.

3. An in-service institute for high school teachers of mathematics will make it possible for 55 experienced high school mathematics teachers to take one course each term during the 1970-71 academic year, from Sept. 3, 1970 to April 28, 1971. The courses will be provided during after-school hours.

Talk Station Goes Musical

WTAK, the controversial all-talk radio station in Garden City, will shift to a music format and change its name next Monday.

More than that, it will change the kind of audience it's seeking. It will be called WID (pronounced "wide") and shoot for the 25-49 age group, says executive vice president Harvey Grace.

The music will feature big-band and happy sounds—Percy Faith, David Rose, Bertie Bacharach, Andy Williams, Sergio Mendes, Grace calls it a sound that

its audience "can listen to all day without getting depressed or developing a nervous tic."

It will broadcast from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and have the same location on the AM dial, 1090. Grace said the name change was necessary to indicate that it's no longer a talk station. Besides happy music, WID will feature news on the hour and short personality features on the half-hour.

Marc Holden, former WTAK news director, has been named WID's program director. Bill Dezell, former program director at WCAR, will start the morning sign-on program.

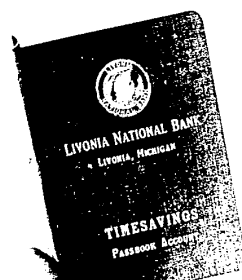

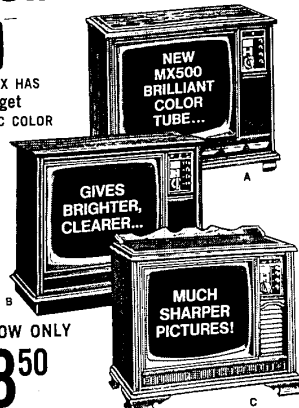
