Cherry Disease Gets Millions Dollar Toll

Damage to the Michigan cherry crops of more than a million dollars is the toll exacted by Leaf Spot, a fungous disease which is prevalent everywhere in the state, according to G. H. Coons, plant pathologist at the Michigan Agricultural College.

"Loss to the fruit is but part of the damage caused by Leaf Spot," says Dr. Coons. "Continued loss of the leaves will so weaken the trees that winter injury looms as a serious menace."

"Prompt inauguration of spraying from now on is strongly urged as a measure to keep the leaves from the disease and to ward off the threatened winter injury. The spraying program of the college has proved adequate in all regions to handle the disease but neglect or carelessness is costing dearly."

1922 Wool Pool Closes Aug. 15.

The state farm bureau is closing its 1922 wool pool August 15. No wool will be accepted after that date, says a bureau announcement.
