John Arthur has treated his house to a coat of paint which greatly improves the appearance.

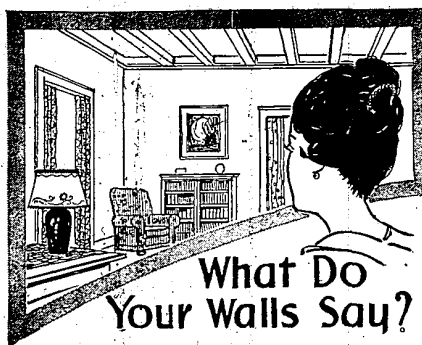
Mrs. J. Pett spent last week with a cousin in Cass City, this week she is with a brother in Detroit.

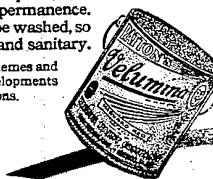

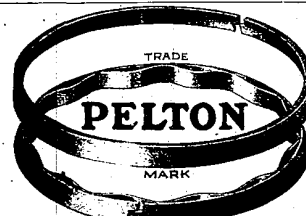
