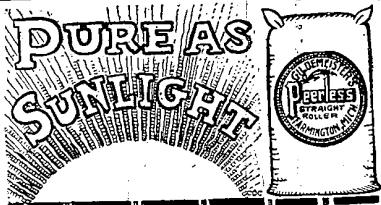

John Scott and daughter, Helen, and Hattie Pierson of North Adams, came Tuesday for a few days visit with Forest Pierson and family.

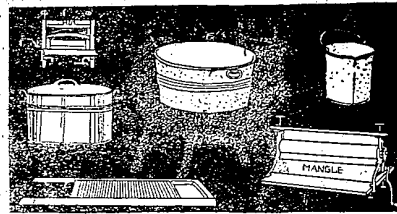

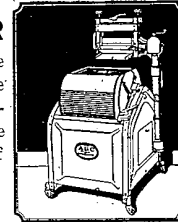

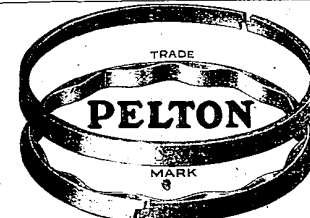
