All classes will be held in the church which is conveniently located at 9601 Hubbard at West Chicago in Livonia and nursery service will be provided for children ages two to six of mothers participating in the program. Morning classes will meet from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.

They include: Basic Painting and Sketching - 10-week course for beginners in all art media. Rhythmic Exercises - 10 weeks of trimming down and tuning up. Decorative Crafts - Six weeks of candle making, plaques, simple picture framing and arrangements. 




