## NO OPEN SEASON

## ON WOOD DUCKS

The closed season on wood ducks, which has been in effect since 1918 under the provisions of the migratory bird treaty act, will continue during the hunting season this fall, according to the bureau of biological survey of the United States department of agriculture. These birds may not be killed anywhere in the United States. The wood duck, or summer duck as it is commonly known in many localities, is one of the most beautiful native game birds, and breeds practically throughout the United States. Formerly it was threatened with extinction but under the protection afforded by the migratory bird treaty act during the past few years its numbers are now beginning to show an increase. Elder ducks and swans are also protected throughout the year.
