SHRIMP'S EARS HIS LEGS

Here's How One May Tell Difference Between Him and His Cousin, the Prawn.

Are shrimps insects? The question is often asked by those who see these active little creatures alive for the first time.

Insects have six legs, but the shrimp has no fewer than 24. He is a crustacean—first cousin of the crab, the lobster and the cockroach.

Many of the "shrimps" that one sees in shops are prawns. You can tell one from the other by looking at the head, says the Detroit News. The prawn has a long sharp-pointed horn edged with teeth like those of a saw. Prawns turn pink when they are boiled, but shrimps become brown in color.

The eyes of a shrimp are easy to see since they stand out on stalks, but you might search for some time if you wish to discover his ears, for he keeps them in a very odd place.

His ears are in his knees. At the first joint of his first pair of legs, which by the way, are not used for walking, is a little bag which contains a minute drop of water, and this water-filled bag acts as an eardrum.

Relics of Spanish Ship.

Recent finds by the treasure-seekers at Tobermory, Scotland, include a muzzle-loading iron gun, four, and a half feet in length, and having a bore of two and a half inches; several broken sword scabbards, and a large silver, possibly silver, which has been taken to experts in London for assay.

In addition, there was brought up almost daily during the last fortnight about twenty of the 20 Spanish Armada ship in an excellent state of preservation. These finds have been added to the relic of a bronze cannon, four and a half feet long, apparently of the same maker. On the iron gun among other things was the royal monogram "P. and J. (Philip and Isabella), whose joint reign lasted from 1493 to 1505."

Liquid Air to Crack Hard Nuts.

The chieftains from South America have some excellent qualities, but it has never been found possible to crack the shells of the nuts. At the same time, United States government authorities at Allied liquid air to the problem. They did not freeze solid a piece of rubber and use it as a hammer, but they used the classic experiment of physics, but they simply immersed the nuts in liquid air for 30 seconds and cracked them easily without damage to the kernels. Now the physicists are trying to find out whether this method can be applied commercially on a large scale. Chilean nuts were used during the war to make charcoal for gas masks and the oil from the kernels is a valuable food similar to copra.

Kimberley's Wealth.

Kimberley, which is but 60 miles from the new South African diamond field, is one of the richest mines in the world. Its yearly output is placed at \$4,000,000. Ninety-nine per cent of all the diamonds produced in the last 20 years are said to have come from South Africa.

Lepers in United States.

The exact number of lepers in this country is not authoritatively known, but there are cases in 25 states and the federal government's only leprosy hospital, located in Louisiana, which can care for 200 patients, has filled to its utmost capacity.

Raising Bees in Bedroom.

A bedroom in Maryland, consisting of ten hives of bees, is a part of the household of Dr. W. B. Starnes of Old, N. Y. His house is situated in the heart of the business district of that city.

Battery Chemistry

The chemical changes which take place in your storage battery are said to be "reversible." That is to say, the acid in the battery solution acts upon the active materials in the plates and electrical current is generated during the process. When electricity is passed into the battery, the changes are reversed and the acid in the plates is liberated and returned to the solution while the plates return to their original composition.

While the battery is discharging the active material of the positive plates which was originally peroxide, becomes lead sulphate through combination with some of the acid in the battery solution. The material of the negative plate that was spongy lead becomes lead sulphate in the same way. The solution becomes weaker in acid by this process as is shown by the lowered density when tested with a battery hydrometer.

Lead sulphate on the plates has a greater volume than the lead peroxide or spongy lead formerly there, and forms a layer of inert material over the remaining active material. Thus the weakening solution cannot penetrate the sulphate to reach more unchanged active materials and the battery becomes less active and its voltage lower.

In recharging a battery, direct current must be passed through the cells in a direction opposite to that of discharge. During the period, the lead sulphate on the positive plate is reconverted into lead peroxide, and the lead sulphate on the negative plate is reconverted into spongy lead. The electrolyte gradually increases in density and at the end of the charge will be of the same strength as before the discharge.

The Willard Storage Battery company of Cleveland, together with most other nationally known storage battery manufacturers have always urged that no other substances of any kind be placed in a lead sulphuric acid battery. The proper chemicals have been placed in these batteries by authorized service stations. None of these chemicals are lost through use or evaporation and nothing but distilled water should be added by their users.
