Cedar Point Expanding

Cedar Point will spend more than \$3 million for the 1970 season which will start May 23 and mark the Sandusky amusement resort's 100th year.
 About half of the budget will go for eight new rides and other new attractions which will increase the amusement area's hourly ride capacity to over 80,000—largest of any amusement park in the nation.
 A new Kiddieland will be the largest in the country.
 The Point's winter work force has been increased from 150 to over 200 in working almost daily to lay foundations for the new rides that will arrive in January and be installed on a new 800-foot mid-
