

Bozo the Clown Sets Performances At State-Wayne

Bozo the Clown comes to the State Theater in Wayne this weekend (Jan. 24 and 25).

The stage show review, produced by Burt Levy, drew an attendance of 17,000 youngsters in ages in six theater matinee engagements in Detroit and suburban areas during 1969.

Doors will be open both days for the performances at 12 noon, with the show scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. Tickets are priced at \$1.50 and may be purchased now at the State Theater box office.

Appearing with Bozo will be Mr. Whooodini and his magic toy shoppe, and Sniffles, the green seven-foot dancing rabbit, along with an all star cast.

An added feature of the show will be the invitation of some members of the audience to appear on stage with Bozo and Mr. Whooodini to vie for prizes in several contests.

Schoolcraft Opens 'Summertree'

"Summertree," the tragic story of a young soldier, is the upcoming production of the Schoolcraft College Masque Players.

Opening night is Feb. 4 with additional performances scheduled for Feb. 5, 6 and 7. Curtain time is 8 p.m. in the Liberal Arts Theater on the campus at 18000 Haggerty. Tickets, which are available in the college bookstore, are priced at \$2 for adults and \$1.50 for students.

"SUMMERTREE" tells the story of a young soldier, who in the last moments of his life sees his past revolving around him. The play opened in New York on Dec. 10, 1969 and is fantasy about the soldier's last life.

The soldier recalls the tree in his backyard at home; he remembers his childhood, his parents, his first and last love affair and romanticizes on the effect of his death on the folks back home.

THE PLAY uses the flashback technique and gives the soldier and audience a chance to see what has gone wrong with the man. The story is not only a comment on war, but it is a statement for people who send their sons off to a mindless-senseless death.

James Bertin of Garden City plays the role of the young man, while Esther Sieracki is the soldier's first love. Dennis Mannisto appears as the other soldier.

The mother and father are played by Charlotte LeBlanc and Ken Cyr, both of Livonia, while Brian Hutslander will be the young boy.

For that reason, although the general public is invited, tickets will be offered at \$2.50 each for general admission and \$5 each for a limited number of reserved seats.

Tickets may be obtained from the DIT Business Office, J.L. Hudson Company, Grinnell's and the Ford Auditorium box office.

Other films scheduled for the semester are, "Yo Yo," a French film, on Friday, Feb. 13; "Shakespeare Wallah," Feb. 20; "Closely Watched Trains," March 6; "Carry on Regardless," March 20; and "Knife in the Water," April 3.

All films in the series are shown in the Liberal Arts Building theater, adjacent to a lighted parking lot at the south end of the Haggerty Road campus. There is no admission charge to the films which will begin at 8:30 p.m. Two films, "Yo Yo," and "Carry On Regardless," will also be shown at 2 p.m.
