SEVENTEEN-year-old Suttle is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George Suttle of West Chicago, Livonia. A student at Livonia's Franklin High School, he is a member of three different symphony orchestras: the Plymouth Symphony, the Livonia Youth Symphony and the Michigan Youth Symphony.

During 1969, Suttle composed and performed a small piece for bass and piano entitled "Idyllic" while a student at the Interlochen National Music Camp.

Since then he has composed a symphony in the "Mozartian style" for a small chamber orchestra. Suttle was soloist at the Dec. 13 opening concert of the Livonia Youth Symphony.

During the summer of 1968, Suttle attended the Schoolcraft College Music School and performed with the Court Orchestra.

He has studied with Paul Staple and is currently a student of Lawrence Hurst of the University of Michigan School of Music.

He was music editor of the Star from 1962 until 1968. He also has had experience as a professional orchestral musician and librarian. He is a graduate of the University of Missouri at Kansas City, with a major in music theory.
