

Electromac Dedicates Farmington Facility

FARMINGTON, Mich., Jan. 20 (AP)—A new industrial firm, with a plant and equipment valued at \$10 million, held a dedication ceremony at the Farmington Electric and Machine Co. building at 23859 Free-way Park Drive.

The firm was founded in 1955 and moved to Farmington from a plant it had outgrown in northwest Detroit.

Electromac, which provides electrical discharge machining services for job shops throughout the metropolitan area, is a pioneer in the field locally and has earned national recognition in metal trade journals because of special applications of the process it has developed.

Among its prime clientele are General Electric, General Motors and Ford.

DELT Ron Burnett says his firm's move enables it to double both its number of employees (now 20) and its employment of manufacturing and servicing equipment.

The new plant, designed by Karp-Maxwell & DeComie Inc., architects, was built by the A. J. Doyle Construction Co., general contractors, of Livonia.

It includes approximately 2,000 square feet of air-conditioned office and sales space with another 9,000 square feet devoted to service and manufacturing activities.

THE SHOP AREA has been light-engineered to provide a minimum of 100 foot candles of illumination three feet off the floor throughout. This will allow movement of equipment throughout the plant without the need for lighting adjustments.

Flexibility of the work area is further enhanced by the installation of Alsvite Structures, a unique translucent plastic which adds to the light availability, and infra red heating units which eliminate the danger of "dust blow" in the work area. A 10-ton Robbins & Myers hoist also has been installed in the plant.

The congressman is a native of Hickory, Illinois' second largest city. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Illinois in 1942. Enlisting in the Army Field Artillery during World War II, he won four battle stars. Returning to the University of Illinois, he was awarded a doctor of law degree in 1956. Subsequently he won a fellowship to Harvard Law School where he received his master of law degree in 1949. While at Harvard he taught at the Northeastern University Law School.

NEW HORIZONS Buys Headquarters

New Horizons of Oakland County, Inc., has announced the purchase of the former City Beverage Warehouse building at 117 Turk in downtown Pontiac to serve as its new headquarters.

The purchase was announced by J. Lyle Winslow, president of the board of New Horizons, Inc.

A five-story one-story facility has a total of 22,000 square feet of space in two buildings which are connected by a covered loading dock.

THE INTERIOR will undergo extensive remodeling to make the building more suitable for New Horizons' program of sheltered workshops, training and evaluation services to the county's physically and mentally handicapped, Winslow stated.

Planned are the addition of a cafeteria, administrative offices, classrooms and activity rooms.

"We are especially indebted to Harold Cousins, president of City Beverage for making it possible for us to purchase this building at very liberal terms," Winslow said. New Horizons has been actively encouraged to establish in the Pontiac area by the North Oakland County New Horizons Workshop Committee, a group formed by three retarded children associations.

"WE EXPECT to be able to expand our services and to inaugurate some needed new programs," Winslow said.

New Horizons, Inc., founded in January 1964, currently operates two sheltered workshops. They are located at 36 E. 14 Mile, Madison Heights, and at 35100 Grand River, Farmington.

The non-profit organization presently assists about 100 men and women who are 16 years and older. The Pontiac facility is expected to increase

Eino J. Heina, district manager of the Pontiac Social Security Office has announced:

"These payments are to be made to coal miners suffering from 'Black Lung Disease,' and also to the families of miners who died of this condition."

"Full details on this new program are not yet available," Heina said, "but anyone in Oakland County who suffers from this condition or who has a friend or relative who does should contact our office as soon as possible so that applications can be taken." Other information will be announced as soon as possible.

The Pontiac Social Security Office is located at 21 South Glenwood and is open from 8:45 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. Monday through Friday and until 7:45 p.m. on Wednesday evenings.
