DIANE KANGAS

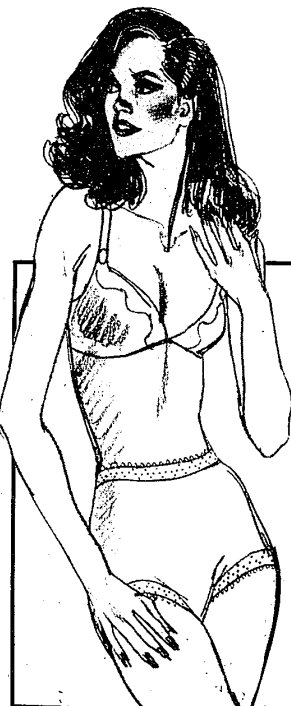
