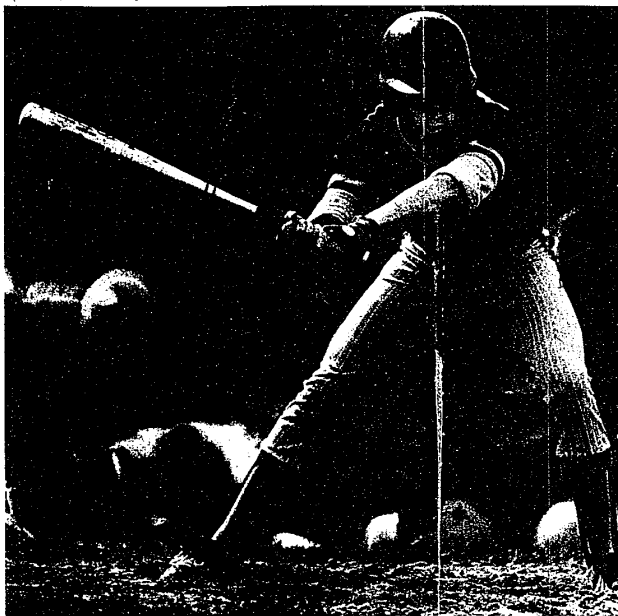

## North rips rival, 6-2

When it comes to prep baseball, North Farmington and West Bloomfield have developed quite a rivalry over the years.

In 1978, North's excellent baseball team had hopes for a long state tournament run. But West Bloomfield, another fine team, crushed those plans by beating the Raiders in a pre-district game.

Last spring, North rebounded to beat West Bloomfield 2-0, in a non-tournament game.

Last Thursday, the two north-suburban baseball powers met again. And North extended its supremacy over West Bloomfield with a 6-2 victory on the Raiders' field. The win was the seventh in a row for North, which owns a 9-4 overall record.

"It was a non-league game, and we have an awfully hectic schedule," said North coach Jerry Maxwell. "But somehow we always manage to get up for West Bloomfield."

Winning pitcher John Jeffery, a junior southpaw, worked five strong innings, striking out six and walking one. He pitched to three men in the sixth and gave up three of his seven hits before being yanked in favor of sophomore Kevin Shaw.

Shaw entered the game with two on and no outs. He struck out the first batter, walked the next man — and then got Joe Przybylowski to hit into a double play to end the threat.

NORTH SCORED three runs in the first inning. Matt Roud, Rex Baker and Jim Carrier all singled to load the

bases. Rich Nutter then walked to push across one run, and Greg Meggas singled to knock in two more.

North added another run in the second when Jeffery tripled and scored on Roud's ground out. In the fourth, Chuck Kott singled, advanced to third on Roud's base hit and scored on a wild pitch. Meggas doubled in the seventh and scored on Pat Carney's single.

Losing pitcher Dave Long went the distance, giving up 12 hits and striking out six. "We had very little trouble with him," Maxwell said. "We were hitting the ball hard — better than we have all year — and we had men on base every inning."

West Bloomfield first baseman Jim Arnold led a sacrifice fly to drive in one run in the first, and then rapped an RBI single in the sixth. Long and Tim Paul each had two hits for the losers.

West Bloomfield has a 9-5 record under first-year coach Larry Reichle.

In another recent game, Farmington Harrison dumped Dearborn Divine Child 10-4 last Thursday in a state

Class B pre-district game in Dearborn. The win boosted Harrison to 9-10 overall.

Winning pitcher Mike Tetreault (9-4) pitched a three-hitter and struck out three. Harrison had 10 hits. Pete Tompson contributed two singles and drove in two runs. Dale Sklar clouted an inside-the-park home run, and Gary Kazanjian had two doubles.

EARLIER LAST week, Plymouth Canton swept a double-header from Harrison, 9-4 and 6-1, in the Western Six League.

Winning pitcher Dan Smith struck out five and allowed seven hits in the first game. Harrison's Pete Tompson blasted a two-run homer in the first inning, and teammate John Recker had a solo homer in the sixth.

Dan Fankhauser's three-hit, eight-strikeout performance paced Canton in the nightcap. But one of those three hits was a solo homer in the sixth inning.

## Mercy golfers advance

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy, paced by junior Meg Mallon, finished first in the state regional girls' golf tournament last Friday with 362 strokes at Burroughs Farms Golf Course in Brighton.

Plymouth Salem placed second with 393 strokes, and West Bloomfield was third with 402. The top three teams advance to the state finals June 3 at the same Burroughs Farms course.

Mallon shot a nine-over-par 82 to lead the 80-girl regional field. Lisa Bileti, a Mercy senior, placed second at 84, and Troy Athens' Cindi Evans was third at 88. Other Mercy finishers: Carol Conway (92) and Lori Hawkins (102).

Mercy plays next today against Birmingham Groves at Springdale Golf Course in Birmingham. The match begins at 4 p.m.

## Marlins miss chance for Central Division title

The girls' track championship of the Catholic League Central Division was at stake last Wednesday when Redford Bishop Borgess ran against Farmington Our Lady of Mercy at Brother Rice High.

Borgess won the meet, 70-53, to finish on top in the Central Division with a 5-0 league record. The loss put Mercy at 5-1 in conference dual meets.

Marianne Hejka of Borgess won two individual events, the 440-yard dash (50.3) and the 800-yard run (2:31.0). Some other Borgess firsts: Jane Witherspoon (1:18 in the 100 dash), Cindy Compton (32.7% in the

shot put), Mary Uter (16.8 in the 100 hurdles), and 32.1 in the 220 hurdles).

Mercy's 440 relay (Chris Lawson, Roxy Johnston, Angie Jagers and Sonya Howcott) won with a time of 52.9. Miriah Sullivan won the 800 (2:29.9), and Mercy teammate Beth Bosse won the discus (106-3).

Shery West, an outstanding sprinter for Mercy last season, returned from an injury against Borgess and finished second in the 100 with a 12.1.

Mercy will participate in the Catholic League meet on Tuesday, May 20, at Madison Heights Bishop

Poley. Events begin at 3 p.m.

In another dual meet last Wednesday, Redford Union downed North Farmington, 717-52, in the Northwest Suburban League. North Farmington finished its dual-meet season at 7-3 overall and 2-3 in the league.

NORTH'S 880 relay (Patty O'Brien, Nancy Hughes, Meg Heinrich and Lori Kolodziej) won in 1:54.7. The Raiders' 440 relay (O'Brien, Heinrich, Connie Peponis and Kolodziej) won in 54.6.

Other North firsts: Hughes (35-1 in the shot put), O'Brien (17.0 in the

110 hurdles), Kolodziej (12.3 in the 100) and Sheri Salkeld (12:35.8 in the two mile).

Cheryl Holt won three events for RU — the 440 (5:19), the 220 (28.2) and the long jump (16'6"). Julie Morris won the 800 (2:33.0), Angie Mogielski won the mile (5:35.0), and Chris Vedder won the discus (105-9).

Chris Looser, a junior on Farmington High's girls' track team, established a varsity record last Wednesday, but her squad dropped a 65-58 decision to Waterford Township in the Inter Lakes League.

Farmington is 9-4 in the ILL. Looser finished the 880 run in

2:31.5 for the record. Julie Tadrzynski won two events for Farmington, the long jump (15-4) and the high jump (4-9). Teammate Ann Barber won the two mile in 12:54.32.

Farmington's Kathy Glowacki won the 110 hurdles in :17.8, and teammate Lori Krench won the 440 in :56.7.

BETH DILLEY won two events, but that showing couldn't save Farmington Harrison from losing to Waterford Mott, 76-48, in a Western Six League meet last Wednesday. Harrison is 2-8 overall.

Dilley won the 110 hurdles (16.2)

and the 220 hurdles (31.4). Renee Faulkner of Harrison won the shot put (25-11), and teammate Sue Kutinsky won the two mile (13:15.6).

Linda Tremonti, usually an outstanding performer for Harrison, didn't compete because of a pulled hamstring muscle suffered while long jumping. On Tuesday, May 20, Farmington will run in the Inter Lakes League meet at Milford Lakeland. On Wednesday, North Farmington travels to Livonia Franklin for the Northwest Suburban League meet. Harrison entertains Livonia Churchill on Wednesday in the dual-meet finale.

## Falcon trackmen triumph



Chris Reynolds and Craig Kiehl each won two individual events last Wednesday to help Farmington High dominate Waterford Township, 96-36, in an Inter Lakes League boys' track meet.

The win closed out Farmington's dual-meet season at 4-4 overall and 2-3 in the conference.

Reynolds won the 120-yard high hurdles (15.6) and the 440-yard dash (54.1), and Kiehl won the discus (125-foot-3) and the 220 dash (24.1).

Farmington won nine more firsts. Eric Leidlin, normally a miler, posted a winning time of 2:04.4 in the half mile. Don Dewar won the long jump (20-6). John Murphy took the mile (4:40.1) and Bill Atkinson won the two mile (10:21.0).

Farmington's 440 relay (Tom Church, Dewar, Kiehl and Kevin Davis) won with a time of 46.0.

In another meet last Wednesday, North Farmington made its eight-straight dual-meet victories with a 94% — 37% victory over Redford Union in the Northwest Suburban League. North owns a 7-1-2 record.

North had three double winners. Gregg Rapp won the 1600-meter run (4:38.0) and the 3200-meter run (10:10.1). Dan Cohen won the 100-meter dash (11.2) and the 200-meter dash (23.4), and George Houttekier won the shot put (46-11) and the discus (129-3).

North's Ted Case won the low hurdles in 44.3, a performance which pleased assistant coach Ed Davis. "He's working hard and coming off an injury, so I was glad to see him hit the tape," the coach said.
