Year In Australia

Maureen Brennan, a Bentley High School junior, flew last weekend into summer and a year's adventure in the "land down under."

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Timothy Brennan, 33025 Ruycroft, Livonia, will spend 1970 as an American Field Service exchange student in Australia, returning next January to graduate with her Bentley class.

"I still can't believe it," Maureen said before winging off on her first plane trip Jan. 18. "Spending a year in Australia is a great privilege and opportunity to learn about other people and customs."

SHE WILL spend the next year in Charters Towers, N. Queensland, a city of 7,000 that is the gateway to the bush country and isolated sections of Australia.

Her "family" will be Mr. and Mrs. Graham Thomson and their five children, Wendy, 14; Ross, 11; 10-year-old twins Penny and David and Jane, eight.

Thomson is principal of Blackheath College for Girls and Thornburgh College for Boys, conducted by the Presbyterian and Methodist Schools' Association. Maureen, who wants to be a teacher, will attend Blackheath in the school year beginning Jan. 24. Since it's now summer in south-of-the-equator Australia, this is the start of the school year.

Four attendants wore long-sleeved wine velvet gowns with ivory lace at the neckline and cuff and each carried three long-stemmed pink roses.

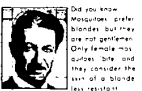
