Live bouzouki music runs continuously with folk dancing and the famous syrtaki (sailor dance), souvlaki and loukoumades.

The sidewalk cafe offers Greek pastry and baked goods with coffee or can be purchased to eat at home.

The Taverna offers a multiple choice of imported Greek wines and liqueurs together with the cheeses and mezedakis (hors d'oeuvres) enjoyed by Greek natives.

Shoppers in the Greek Boutique will find the newest in imported jewelry, crafts and novelties.

Imported Greek fashions and the Mykonos sailor caps will be available. Colorful dancers in native costumes will entertain, then invite guests to join in the syrtaki.

Glendi runs from 6 p.m. to midnight on Friday and Saturday and from noon to 7 p.m. Sunday.

A \$1 admission charge will be asked at the gate.



MONTE NAGLER

Columnist teaches picture-taking

Award-winning photographer and columnist for Observer & Eccentric Newspapers Monte Nagler will share his insight into the art of creative picture-taking in a class sponsored by Farmington Community Center this summer.

His four-session workshop will meet from 7:30-9 p.m. on Tuesday, beginning July 8, in the center, 24705 Farmington Road.

Nagler is a West Bloomfield resident, local businessman and president of Greater Detroit Camera Club Council.

He is the recipient of numerous local, national and international photographic awards. He is holder of the Grand Prize won in 1979 from Detroit News Photo Contest and winner of the Kodak International Snapshot Award.

His work is represented by Haleside Gallery in Birmingham, Blist Gallery

in Ann Arbor, Gilbert Gallery in Chicago and Photography Gallery in San Diego.

He has studied with Ansel Adams and is planning to be part of the renowned photographer's staff in Yosemite Summer Workshop in 1981.

THE SUMMER class he brings to Farmington will emphasize the basic workings of a student's camera.

From there, students will learn the intricacies of film, lighting techniques, depth of field, use of filters and dark-room procedures.

"The true lens of the camera is the heart and mind of the photographer," Nagler said. "Therefore, the camera doesn't make a photograph. It's you, the photographer."
