11 Observerland Youths Win Evans Scholarships

Eleven youths, who have served area golf courses as caddies during the past several years, are among 31 outstanding Michigan residents awarded Chick Evans college scholarships by the Golf Association of Michigan. 18 to Michigan State University and 13 to the University of Michigan.

Announcement of the scholarships was made by Frank E. Kenney, of Detroit, chairman of the GAM's caddie-scholarship committee.

The 11 area winners were nominated by Meadowbrook, Western and Plum Hollow golf courses.

THE AWARDS BRING to 519 the number of scholarships given by the Association since it affiliated in 1948 with the nationwide Evans Scholars Foundation, administered by the Western Golf Association of Golf, Ill.

The 31 Michigan winners are

among 240 new grants to be made on a national basis this winter by the 15 regional and state golf associations affiliated with the program.

There will be more than 100 GAM Evans scholars enrolled this fall at Michigan State and the University of Michigan. These are two of the 12 major

universities at which the Foundation's chapter houses, which are managed and maintained by the scholars.

EACH SCHOLARSHIP is valued at approximately \$3,500. Financial support for the program comes from more than \$2,000,000 in donations, more than 12,700 who contribute annually to the James D. Stansbury Jr. Fund.

To qualify a boy must caddy at least two years, must rank in the upper 25% of his high school graduating class and must require financial aid to attend college. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis using these factors.

DRC To Open Facilities For Snowmobiles

Paul Ryder, Detroit Race Course vice president, Tuesday announced that DRC plans to open two cross-country snowmobiling areas on its 240 acre grounds at Middlebelt and Schoolcraft Roads on Saturday, January 31 and Sunday, February 1 from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M.

An admission charge of five dollars per snowmobile will be charged at the main entrance on Schoolcraft Road.

Initially, the track will offer two cross-country areas; one, called the "back forty" is west of the club house along Middle Belt; the other, measuring over a mile in length, is a 60 foot wide snowcovered roadway that circles the mile oval track.

Ryder said that rest rooms and a hot drink stand will be available.

DURING THIS TEST RUN, no rental units will be offered. Only cars trailing snowmobiles and entering through the main gate will be permitted on the grounds.

"This past fall," Ryder added, "we met with snowmobile association officials throughout the state to begin planning a major international race event, the Motor City Snowmobile Classic, to be held some time in the future."

Snowmobilers may call the Detroit Race Course at Garfield 1-7700 for up-to-date snow conditions.
