## Tax Dates Compiled In Booklet

The annual general tax calendar covering deadlines for federal, state and local taxes throughout 1970 has been published by the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce.

The 20-page booklet lists latest dates by which returns must be filed and taxes paid to federal, state, City of Detroit and Wayne County governments. It is organized on a month-by-month basis up to early January 1971.

Biggest months of the year for tax deadlines are March 15 and April 15.

## Burrughs Net Is Up 27 Pct.

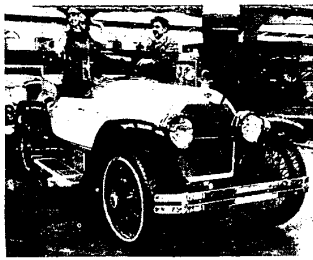
Ray W. Macdonald, president of Burrughs Corp., has reported record earnings and revenue for 1969. The Detroit-based company has a Plymouth plant.

Adjusted net earnings for 1969 were \$5,198,000, a 27% increase over 1968 net earnings of \$4,100,000.

Net earnings per share for 1969 were \$3.22 on 16,557,400 average shares outstanding for the year. In 1968 net earnings per share were \$2.54 with 16,914 average shares outstanding. Shares outstanding for both periods are based on the stock split effective March 28, 1969.

Fourth quarter net earnings in 1969 were \$2,957,000 or \$1.49 per share, a 25% increase over the net earnings for the 1968 fourth quarter of \$1,951,000, or \$1.21 per share.

Macdonald said worldwide commercial product income during 1969 declined 29%. Combined commercial and government income orders in 1969 were 14% higher than in 1968.

## Esch Urges More Money, Less Control For Schools

Colleges are no longer independent but interdependent. The term "academic freedom" has taken on a new meaning and government is playing an increasingly powerful role in educational affairs. Sen. Frank P. McCloskey, D-Mich., said in a speech at the University of Michigan last week. Government at all levels, Esch noted, appears headed toward a broader involvement with academic institutions in the next decade. As the university communities have rather sheltered walls and reach out to involve themselves in the real issues of the day, they will find themselves increasingly at cross-purposes with those in positions of authority in government.

A key reason, he said, is federal funding. Federal legislation in this decade should be structured so as to maximize delivery of funds and minimize control, but he warned.

There are many who have a growing disbelief in the ability of college administrators to control campus conditions. Esch asked the educators whether the function of the contemporary campus under the umbrella of academic freedom is to serve as a free forum for the expressions of ideas and protest, or does the campus have an inherent responsibility to the one institution in our society that produces components of analytical analysis.

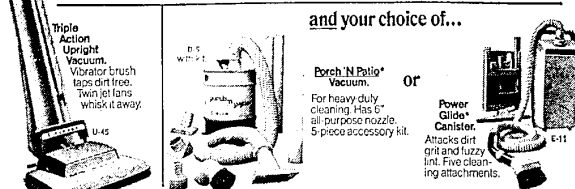
