### Dwyer Wins Golf Grant

Frederick R. Dwyer Jr., 17, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Dwyer of 31900 Allison, Farmington, has been awarded a college scholarship valued at approximately \$3,500 by the Golf Association of Michigan.

To qualify for a scholarship, a boy must reside at least two years, must rank in the upper 25% of his high school graduating class and must require financial aid to attend college. The Clark Evans college scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis using these factors.
