

'Dressed to Kill' copies Hitchcock without humor

Brian De Palma makes no bones about his indebtedness to Alfred Hitchcock, but his work does raise the question, where does homage end and larcenty begin?

De Palma's most recent film, "Dressed to Kill" (R), borrows heavily from Hitchcock's "Psycho," even to a shower scene and a transexual murderer. It also uses a favorite Hitchcock theme, the innocent, but not entirely innocent) bystander who becomes involved because he or she has the misfortune to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

Nancy Allen, playing a high-priced call girl, is the beset bystand-er who witchesse a grisly murder, becomes suspected by the police and hunted by the razor-wielding killer.

ALLEN SHOWS a lot of poise in this role. She puts on an air of bravado for the police, is seductive with clients and warm and friendly with the distraught teenage son (Keith Gordon) of the victim

In control, Angie Dickinson's flat performance as a dissatisfied,
sex-hungry wife reinforces one's convictions that her falents are
better suited to the samil screen services of the performance as a psychiatrist
with a dangerous patient and a missing razor.

De Palma keeps the pulse-pumping suspense level high through
a series of joilst that alternate between steamy, crotic passages
and blood-spurting violence.

In spite of major lapses in logic, the director is able to hold
everything together by manipulating the viewer's emotions
through purely vissal devices — clever camera angles, multiple
images and mirror shots. Even when the murdorer is uncovered
and you can guess the identity long before that), the spine thingling
continues with an ending De Palma borrows from himself ("Carrie").

The director's cinematic resourcefulness and inventiveness are impressive. What he lacks, and what Hitchcock employed so effectively, is an urbane sense of humor.

THERE IS VERY little comic relief in De Palma's work, no lightness to balance the bloodshed. And the sex is graphic and mean, where Hitchcock would have used innuendo and suggestion. Beginning with masturbation and sexual fantaxy in the shower. "Dressed to Kill" pushes the R rating to the edge of the X rating, not only because of the sex but because of the language, violence and theme. This is not a film for the delicate minded.


