
## OU Course Set Fpr 35 'Gifted' HS Students

Oakland University has received a \$19.984 grant from the National Science Foundation to support a summer program for 35 gifted area high school science and mathematics students.

The NSF Student Science Training program is designed to offer educational experiences in science and mathematics beyond those available in high school or early college. James McKay, chairman\_of the OU mathematics department, will direct the project.

High school students interested in applying should contact Prof. McKay for application materials. The summer program will run from June 22 through Aug. 7.




## Finally, A Bachelor
