

CYO Opens Nominations For Awards

The Archdiocese Catholic Youth Organization is now accepting nominations for its annual Ed Crowe Awards, which are presented to volunteers who have done outstanding work for a minimum of two years in any facet of the CYO parish program.

This includes those who have worked directly with youth in athletics, teen and young adult clubs, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and Camp Fire Girls, and in other CYO projects.

APPLICATION blanks may be obtained now from the Catholic Youth Organization Awards Committee, 355 Michigan Ave., Detroit 48226 (965-7172). In all likelihood, the local pastors or CYO activities chaplain has already received such forms.

All nominations must be approved by the parish pastor or by the activities chaplain. In order to be considered, nominees must be returned to the Awards Committee not later than Feb. 15.

There is no limit on the number of Ed Crowe Awards which may be presented. The CYO will also present two other awards for distinguished service: The Monsignor Markey Award, to a priest who has done exceptional work for youth, and the Joe Glaser Award, to a member of the CYO board of directors who has made notable contributions to the success of the program.

THE AWARDS honor three pioneers who founded the CYO and did much to make it what it is today. Monsignor Harold J. Markey was the organization's spiritual director for more than a quarter of a century. Crowe was its director from 1933 to his death in 1960. Glaser was the first president of the board and its leader for many years.

Presentations will be made at the annual awards dinner March 15 at Mercy College, Detroit.

Catholic Lenten Series

Historical background for the current Lenten series of the Catholic parish of today will be the theme of seven Tuesday evening programs during Lent for Catholics in the Farmington-Southfield Vicariate.

The sessions will be held from 8:30 to 10 p.m. beginning Feb. 10 in St. Gerald Catholic Church, 21300 Farmington Road.

Presenting the programs will be the Rev. Richard Fournier, named by the Detroit Archdiocese to work in the vicariate. Eugene Grabbe, lay assistant in St. Clare church; Harry Chisholm, director of the archdiocese office of information and sister Jean Elizabeth, O.S.F., religious coordinator for St. Clare.

Religious philosophies of three men, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Teilhard de Chardin and Martin Buber, will be discussed in the course of the series as participants investigate thoughts and lives of influential contemporary thinkers.

The first session will feature a film documentary, "Road Signs on a Merry-Go-Round," first produced as an hour-long feature by CBS.

The pre-registration fee of \$5 to cover materials should be mailed to Fr. Fournier at St. Gerald or presented at the first session. The sessions also may be attended on an individual basis for \$1 each.
