been set into a small Italian straw basket. The bulb, planted in lumus-rich woodland soil, is in position so the top half of the bulb is exposed. She waters the amaryllis, as the does all her plants, with collected rain water or melted soow, and feeds it with a rapid acting plant food she dissolves in the rain water.

PLOWER PRODUCTION reduces the size of the bulb, so as soon as the flowers fade feeding with the fertilizer liquid should begin, Also, for the best flower production, the experts recommend that bulbs that have bloying be given a resting period beginning in late summer.

At that time, the plants
should be exposed to full sunlight, but water should gradually be withheld until the
leaves yellow and fade. Then
watering is stopped completely
and the bulbs should be stored,
still in their post, turned on
their sides. Store in a cool but
not freezing place. Fifty-degree temperature is ideal.

In winter at the end of the resting period, repent the bulb of the strain period, repent the bulb of the strain period away from the roots and put it into a pot only slightly larger in diameter than the bulb. Use a pot that has good drainage, and use a rich porous soil, working it down around the bulb, but leaving the top half of the strain period with the str

ANOTHER CONVERSA-TION piece that Ida Neal is displaying these days is an odd and unusual plant called "dev-il"s tongue. Which has a strange, exotic flower similar to an over-sized calla lify bloom.

Botanically, this native of Indo-Chino (Vietnam) is known as Amorphophallus rivieri, or by some authorities as Hydrosme rivieri.

Eventually the flower will wither and the stalk will die down. Later, another stalk will grow, this topped by three palm-like branching, segmented leaves.

THE DEVIL'S tongue is a member of the Arum family to which belong many other trop-cal plants which are used as houseplants. Best known are the philodendrons, but also included are calla lilies, caladiam, antimin, diffenbachia, and the plant called Chinese evergreen.

Alson in this family are such Alson in this family are such North American native plants as water arum, jack-in-the-pult, and skunk cabbage. The leaf shapes are exceedingly varied, and the plant forms vary from low and fleshy to wire high-climbing vines. All, however, have flowers shaped much, like the blossom on Mrs. Neal's devil's tongue.
