Consumers may note a greenish or straw-color in egg whites rather than the crystal clear color they expect. They wonder what is wrong with this egg. The answer is: "nothing," according to Dr. Glenn

Fronting, associate professor of poultry science at the University of Nebraska. Researchers have found that greenish or straw-colored whites usually are due to the riboflavin (Vitamin B2) in the white.
