Raiders sink Redford Union; Plymouth outswims Harrison

North Farmington stopped Redford Union in a Northwest Suburban League girls' swimming meet Thursday night, and the victory meant a lot to second-year coach Jordan Hatch.

"By winning this meet, we earned at least a share of the Northwest Suburban title," said Hatch, whose squad has a 3-6 mark in the league and a 4-3-1 overall mark.

"I'm sure we'll go 5-0 in the conference because the next two teams we swim against (Livonia Franklin and Garden City East) aren't as strong as the ones we've beaten."

North won nine of the 11 events.

Mary Manderfield won the 200-yard freestyle (2:06.1) and the 100 freestyle (1:37.8), and teammate Kirsten Kinsman won the 200 individual medley (2:23.1) and the 500 free (5:36.6).

Both North relays finished first. The medley team (Kinsman, Mary Shuey, Katy Harnden and Michele Lister) won in 2:01.5. The freestyle crew (Monique Loek, Stacy Greenberg, Helen Sue Howard and Manderfield) won with a time of 4:05.8.

Lister won the 50 freestyle (26.6). Harnden won the 100 butterfly (1:04.8) and Shuey won the 100 breaststroke (1:14.2).

Redford Union's Laura Walligora won the 100 backstroke in 1:07.4, and teammate Michelle Chaffin won the diving event with 149.60 points.

On Tuesday, Nov. 4, North Farmington travels to West Bloomfield for a non-league meet which begins at 7 p.m.

HARRISON'S NANCY Whittemore won two individual events, but her team fell to Plymouth Canton, 94-78, in a Western Six League meet Thursday night in Plymouth. Harrison dropped to 2-9 overall.

Whittemore won the 50 free (22.1) and the 100 fly (1:08.4) and swam a leg on the Hawks' 400 free relay (with Sue

Waak, Niki Allen and Helen Tucker), which won with a 4:14.2 clocking.

Tucker finished second in the 200 free (2:19.5) and Waak was runner up in the 100 free (1:04.4).

Canton's Kim Massey won the 200 free (2:39.5) and the 100 back (1:09.3), and teammate Missy McMurray won the 200 IM (2:34.8). Debbie Dickenson won the 100 free (1:03.5), and Mary Reardon took the 500 free (6:11.5) for Canton.

Harrison travels to Novi for a 7 p.m. meet on Tuesday. Farmington High's swim team swims next on Thursday at Livonia Stevenson.
