Film shows methods of scientific research

"The Early Americans," a film that explores scientists' methods of researching the past, will be shown at 2:45 and 3:45 p.m. Nov. 22 at the Cranbrook Institute of Science, Bloomfield Hills.

The 40-minute film describes the work of geologists, archeologists and anthropologists who study American sites of plant, animal and human life from prehistoric times through European settlement.

Viewers will see a student patiently brushing away the dust of millennia from bones of mammoths at a prehistoric kill site and a laboratory where

fragments of burned wood from hunters' campfires are radiocarbon dated.

"The Early Americans" is part of a Saturday film program at the institute, which offers natural history and science films at no cost beyond museum admission of \$2.50 for adults, \$1.50 for students and senior citizens.

Also included in Saturday museum admission are planetarium demonstrations at 2, 3, 4 and 7:30 p.m. and observatory demonstrations from 8:30-10 p.m.

Saturday hours are 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. For more information call 645-3210.

section of the road, council members said they were puzzled that homeowners chose to speak against the project after it had been in the planning stages for several years.

Association representatives said they were unaware of the project's impact on their area until this past June.

While he did not support either side of the argument at the meeting, Councilman Earl Oppenheimer told homeowners that the time to make a "hub-bub" is at the outset of the project.

He stressed, however, that the council's final recommendation to the road commission should not be based purely on the project's effect on the subdivisions.

"If I think the whole community needs it, I will vote for it regardless of what people on Orchard Lake think of it," he said.


The project is proposed for Orchard

Lake Road from Grand River in Farmington to Willoway in West Bloomfield. Each of the cities involved in the project contribute toward the construction cost as do the road commission and the federal government.

Their monetary contribution gives the city governments leverage in recommending if the project should run through their area.

The road commission receives its revenue from state gas and weight taxes, which have decreased from previous years. The commission, which did not expect to complete the entire Orchard Lake Road project in one effort, is deciding which section will undergo construction next, commission spokesman Dennis Pajot said.

The decrease in the commission's funds has set back the project but money has already been budgeted to acquire right of ways along the road, he said.
