MICHIGAN GOV. William G. Milliken, the man sure to be

seeking his first election to that post this fall, will appear at the 15th Congressional District affair in Wayne County Feb. 24 in the Dearborn Inn.

On Feb. 29 the Second Congressional District of Wayne County will have U.S. Sen. Robert P. Griffin, who is often in the news but who doesn't face re-election until the fall of 1972. That dinner is in the Mayflower Meeting House.

Rep. John Anderson of Illinois, leading anti-pollution fighter in Washington, will speak at the Oakland County dinner on Lincoln Day, Feb. 12, in the Raleigh House, Southfield.

CONGRESSMAN MARVIN ESCH (R-2nd District), whose district includes Plymouth,

Plymouth Township and Northville Township, will speak in Lenawee (Feb. 27) and Eaton (Feb. 14) counties.

Washington County will host former Michigan Gov. George Romney Feb. 23. Romney is now secretary of Housing and Urban Development in President Richard Nixon's cabinet.

Kuhn Pushes

State Sen. George W. Kuhn's resolution before the state Legislature to ask voter approval of the death penalty for killing police and firemen is currently undergoing committee hearings.

The West Bloomfield Republican Senator, whose 14th District includes Livonia, Plymouth and Farmington, was "pleased and gratified" with the results of the first hearing in Lansing.

SEN. KUHN SAID, "Society needs some means to protect itself against the terrible brutality that threatens our first line of protection. The current trend of increasing homicides threatens our free society as we know it."

"If we could have measures which would even psychologically prove a deterrent and save the life of only one officer, then I think this law would be justified."

If his resolution is approved by two-thirds of the Legislature, it would be referred to the voters at the next general election.

"The least we can do is allow the people to decide this grave question of limited capital punishment. The ultimate and final decision should rest with the people," he said.

"As of Jan. 1, 1969, out of 52 legal jurisdictions which include the federal government

and the District of Columbia, about forty still retain capital punishment in some form. Most significantly, some eight states have restored the death penalty after once having abolished it," Kuhn said.

In addition to the strong support by police enforcement agencies, he said his mail from the public on this subject has been very strong in support of some form of capital punishment.
