

Wrestlers In Spotlight At Three Loop Meets

It'll be title time for area prep wrestlers Saturday.

League championships will come up in the Suburban Six, Northwest Suburban and Wayne-Oakland Leagues.

The Suburban Six and NW meets to be held at Allen Park and Thurston, respectively, shape up as thrillers in every sense of the word. If one is to base a prediction on what happened in dual meet competition so far this winter.

In the Suburban Six meet, Redford Union, Belleville and Trenton all go for the title after winning four out of five in league action.

RU beat Belleville, Belleville beat Trenton and Trenton topped RU to account for the lone defeats for the three contenders.

A SIMILAR situation prevails in the NW meet. North Farmington, Glenn and Franklin all carry 4-1 dual meet records into the championship meet.

"Take your pick on who'll meet in our league," said Coach Larry Fortner of RU. "It could go any way."

Redford Union was second in the league last season and will be led into the 1970 meet by Bob Metz, who started as a 145-pounder and now is going at 137 pounds. Metz is unbeaten in 10 matches.

Chip Woods (145), has lost only once. Dennis Campbell, a 107-pounder and a sophomore, has a 16-2 record, while Bill McCurry at 115 carries a 7-2 mark.

Frederick Lozan (130), Rich Hagopian (155), John Peach (185) and Tony Long (heavyweight) also figure to score prominently for RU.

Bentley will have one standout in the meet in Roger Moore at 165 pounds.

GLENN WILL BE the defending champ in the Northwest Suburban League, but North Farmington appears to have a slight edge after winning in the Redford Union and North Farmington Invitational earlier this season.

Standouts include Mark Geier of Franklin and Ken Haller of North Farmington at 98 pounds; Tom Neal of Glenn at 107; Ray Toohy (NF) at 123; Layman McLille (Glenn) and Jay Pease (NF) at 145; Craig Gow (F) at 155; Steve Loe (NF) and Lang (Franklin) at 185; and Sam Leo (Glenn) heavyweight.

Clarenceville will host the Wayne-Oakland League meet. The Trojans aren't expected to cause much of a threat for the crown.

The Inter-Lakes League will not have a league meet this year.

MHSAA Sets Swim Meet Standards

If you're a high school swimmer this winter and have eyes set on qualifying for the state meet, the Michigan State Association has announced minimum times you'll have to attain during the regular season.

There are separate listings for Class A and B teams.

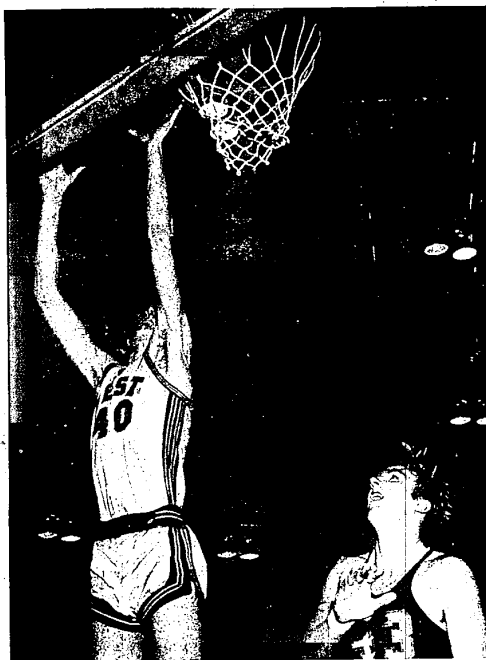
Unless a swimmer equals or surpasses the posted standard, he can't contest for state honors.

Here are the minimums:

When it comes to dividing, a prep must have placed first in at least six Class A dual meets or must finish among the first four in his league meet.

In addition he must have averaged at least 80 points per varsity meet under a one-judge system or 190 points on a three-judge system with a minimum of six meets.
