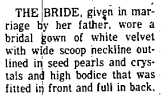

Wedding pictures will be accepted no more than one month after the wedding.

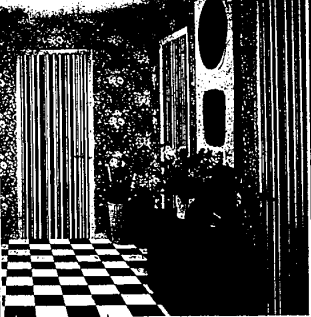
