

U-M Gilbert And Sullivan Society Brings 'Pinafore' To Schoolcraft

A performance of Gilbert & Sullivan's timeless success "H.M.S. Pinafore," featuring soloists from the University of Michigan's Gilbert & Sullivan Society, and visits by three poets, including a return appearance by Thomas Fitzsimmons, are among scheduled events on the Schoolcraft College winter semester Humanities Series in coming weeks.

"Pinafore" will be presented at 8 p.m., Friday, Feb. 27 in the Lois L. Waterman Campus Center. As with other events on the college Humanities Series, admission is complimentary and open to the public.

DIRECTED and conducted by Bradley Bloom of the col-

lege music department, the operetta will present the Schoolcraft Chorale as the chorus of sailors and sisters, cousins, and aunts.

The nine principals will be those who appeared in the performances to standing room houses in Ann Arbor in early December. Bloom, who is musical director of the U-M Gilbert and Sullivan Society, was successful in persuading the cast members to join his company at Schoolcraft for the Feb. 27 performance.

The schedule for the three poets brings Fitzsimmons to the campus at 8 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 19; Robert Mezey on Wednesday, March 11 for a

poetry discussion at 3 p.m., and a reading at 8 p.m.; and Robert Bly for a reading at 8 p.m., on Monday, April 13.

The three readings will be in the Liberal Arts building theater.

FITZSIMMONS, professor and poet in residence at Oakland University, will offer a presentation containing his 90-page poem, "Three voices, shaped space, lightplay, percussion, kalimba, guitar, movement, and silence." The work was produced by Thomas Aston of S.E.T. Theater at Oakland U.

Mezey, a Philadelphia, is now living in the Sierra Bloun-

tain but will shortly move to England where the Oxford Press will publish his "Selected Poems," this spring. His first book, "The Lovemaker," won the Lamont Poetry Prize for 1968. He is the co-editor of "A new anthology of 20th Century American poetry," "Naked Poetry," published by Bobbs-Merrill, and has done other anthologies and translations.

Bly is living in his native Minnesota where he earns his living writing poetry, translating Scandinavian literature, and by giving poetry readings at college campuses across the country. In his magazine, "The Sixties" (begun as "The Fifties"), Bly has introduced relatively unknown European and South American poets to the United States. The Sixties Press has published some of their work in book form.

PRINCIPALS for the performance of "Pinafore" will include James Bryan who is assistant choral director at Bentley High in Livonia. Bryan will be seen as Ralph Backstraw. Others on the roster are Charles Sutherland as Sir Joseph Porter, and Nancy Jaynes Bloom as Josephine.



SOUGHT BY POLICE - Melene S. One-Act Contest Underway

The Community Theatre Association of Michigan (CTAM) is currently accepting scripts for its annual one-act play writing contest.

Entries should be sent to Lois M. Tabin, 811 Helen, Garden City 48135, and must be postmarked no later than Feb. 15.

CTAM has included a new category in this year's contest - that of children's plays.

AWARD WINNING plays will be retained by the CTAM, and these plays will be eligible for reading and production, royalty free, for a one-year period to member groups of CTAM. After that, plays will be available for reading and selection, but royalty arrangements must be made directly with the author.

Awards will be: first place, a \$50 cash prize; second - \$25; and third - \$10. A \$25 cash prize will be awarded for the children's play division.

CONTEST rules are: You must be a resident of the State of Michigan.

Manuscripts must be typewritten and submitted in duplicate.

All entries must be submitted with two title sheets - one with the author's name and address and one without any name. The author's name will not be submitted to the judges.

The following phrase should appear on the first page of the manuscript - "Copyright 1970."

More than one play may be submitted by the same person.

A return envelope and postage should accompany all entries.

One-act manuscripts must be original, unpublished plays, not to exceed 45 minutes playing time.

Manuscripts of children's plays should have a playing time of 45 minutes to one hour. Winners will be announced and the awards presented during the 1970 spring convention of the CTAM in Lansing on May 9.

Stockmeyer Considers U.S. Senate Campaign

WESTLAND'S Norman Stockmeyer is more interested in getting Gov. William Milliken elected this fall than in running for the U.S. Senate.

Stockmeyer, of 38042 Glenwood, made his political feelings known last week after his name was one of 25 being considered by Michigan Republican leaders as a possible candidate opposing Democratic Sen. Philip A. Hart.

"MY CHIEF TASK is doing what I can to retain Milliken," Stockmeyer said. He pointed out that he also wants a Republican Senate candidate who will help, not hurt Milliken's campaign this fall.

Although Stockmeyer said he is "giving serious consideration" to the Senate race, the long-time GOP figure made numerous references to the time and energies required for his job as chairman of the Wayne State University Board of Governors.

That job takes at least two days a week, Stockmeyer said in pointing out that he is also a member of the Wayne County Intermediate School District board.

His political record goes back more than 33 years when he was named a Zoning Board of Appeals member in then-Nankin Township.

He served four terms on the Wayne Community Board of Education and is in his second term on the Wayne County school board.

On the state level, Stockmeyer was secretary of the state Republican party for eight years and chairman of the Wayne County party organization for five years.

Stockmeyer was elected to the Wayne State Board of Governors in 1966 and polled 200,000 more votes than the rest of the state Republican ticket.

WHEN ASKED whom he favors for the Senate race among the political figures mentioned, Stockmeyer didn't commit himself but pointed out that he is very impressed with Congressman Donald Riegle of Flint who lunched with the WSU chairman Thursday.

Riegle and other Michigan congressmen may make good senatorial candidates but there is a chance that they may lose their seats in Congress and their seniority if they oppose Hart and Inse, Stockmeyer said.

He praised the abilities of former governor George Romney and his wife, Mrs. Renne Romney, "who would be a good vote getter."

The former county chairman also made it clear some of the 25 persons being considered for the Senate race "wouldn't help Milliken get elected to a full four-year term."

He declined to mention names but under questioning admitted that the two men he had in mind were State Sen. Robert Huber and State School Board Member James O'Neill, both conservatives.

State Republican leaders will meet Feb. 21 to discuss the prospective senate candidates.

STRESSING that he hasn't made up his own mind on the race, Stockmeyer said that he would talk to his wife, "do some soul searching and wrestling with my conscience."

Milliken sent letters to each of the 25 potential candidates and asked them to reply on whether they will be willing to run for the Senate nomination. Stockmeyer said that he will reply to the governor's letter this week.
